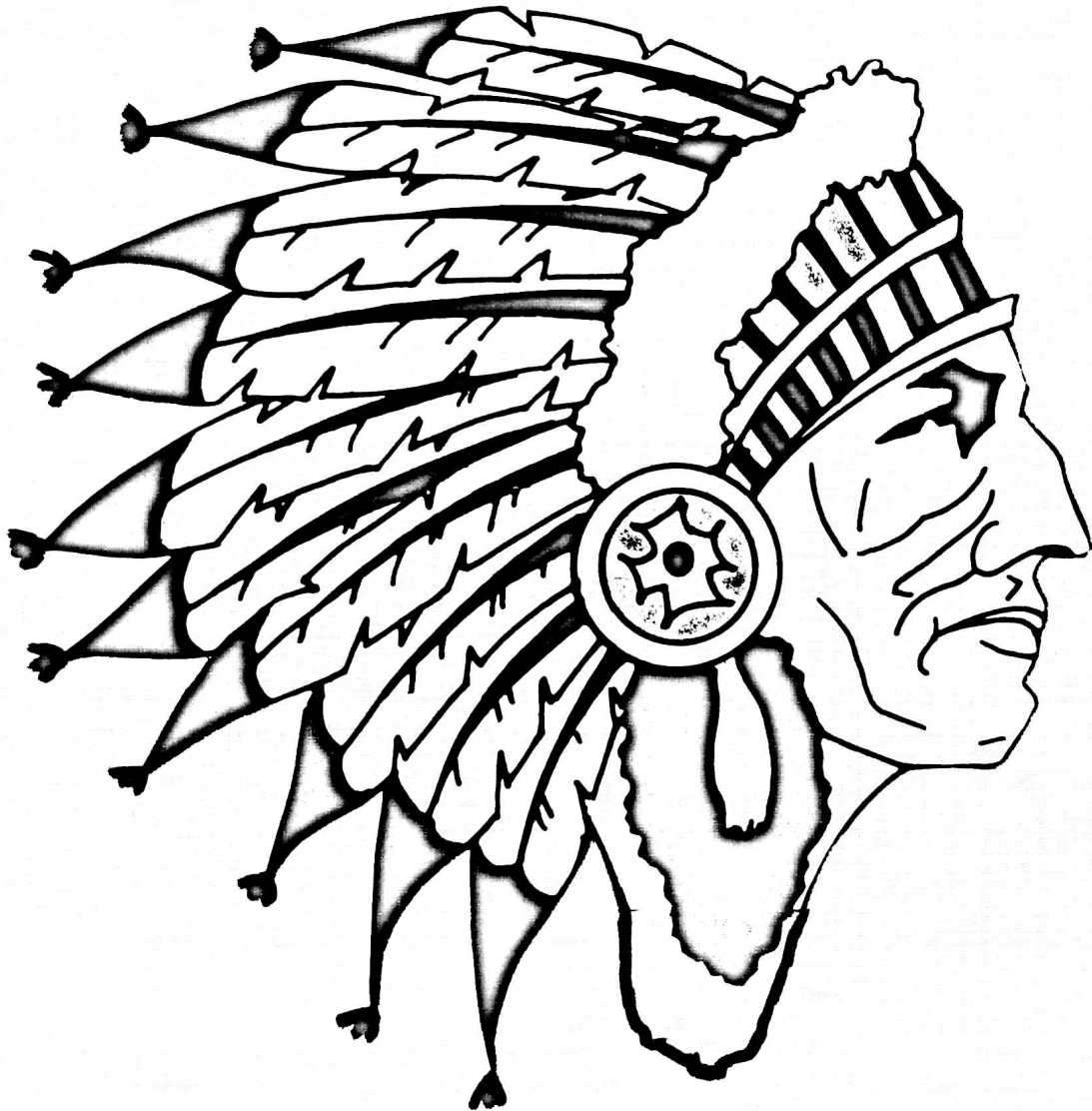

--College Fees: Usually, they range from \$10 to \$15, but they can add up especially if you apply to more than one college.

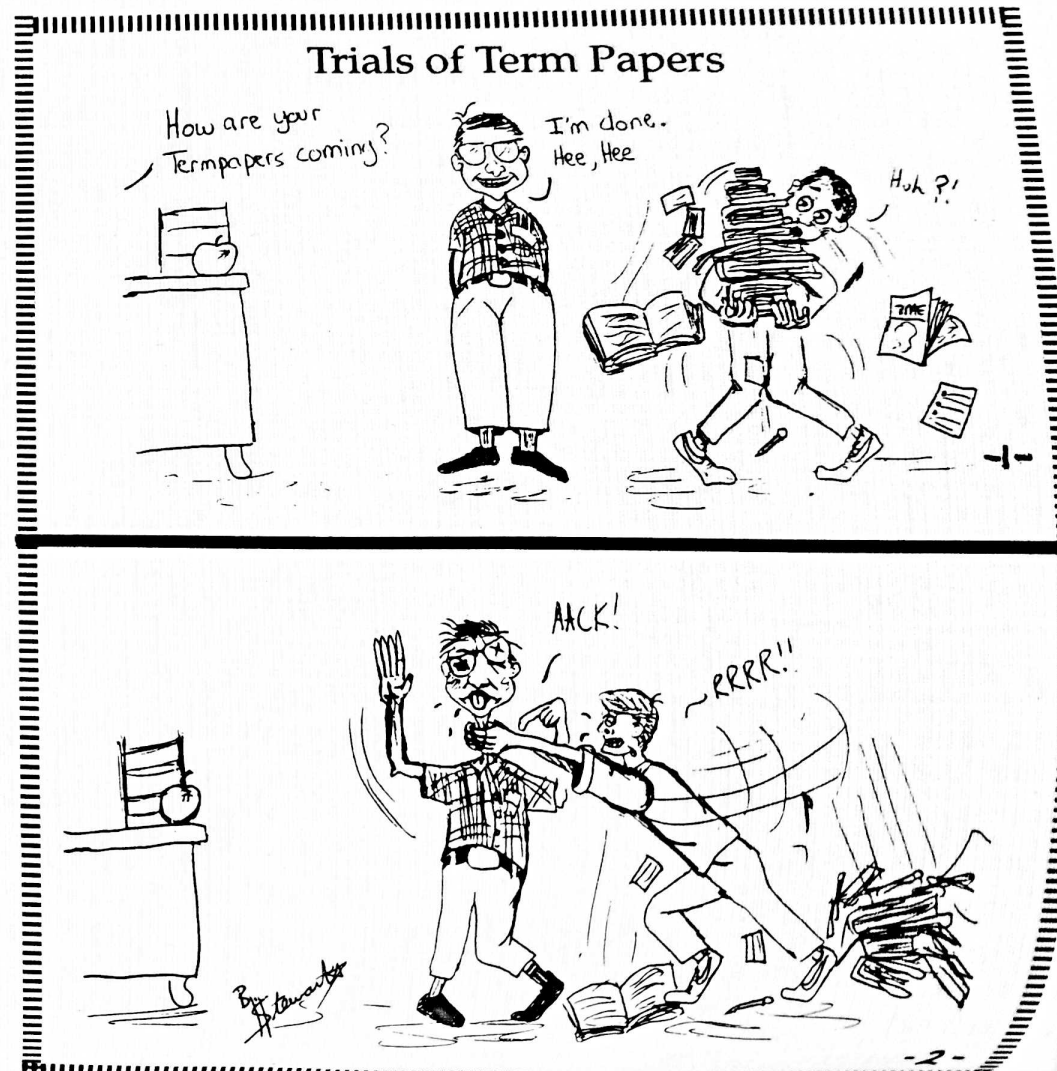
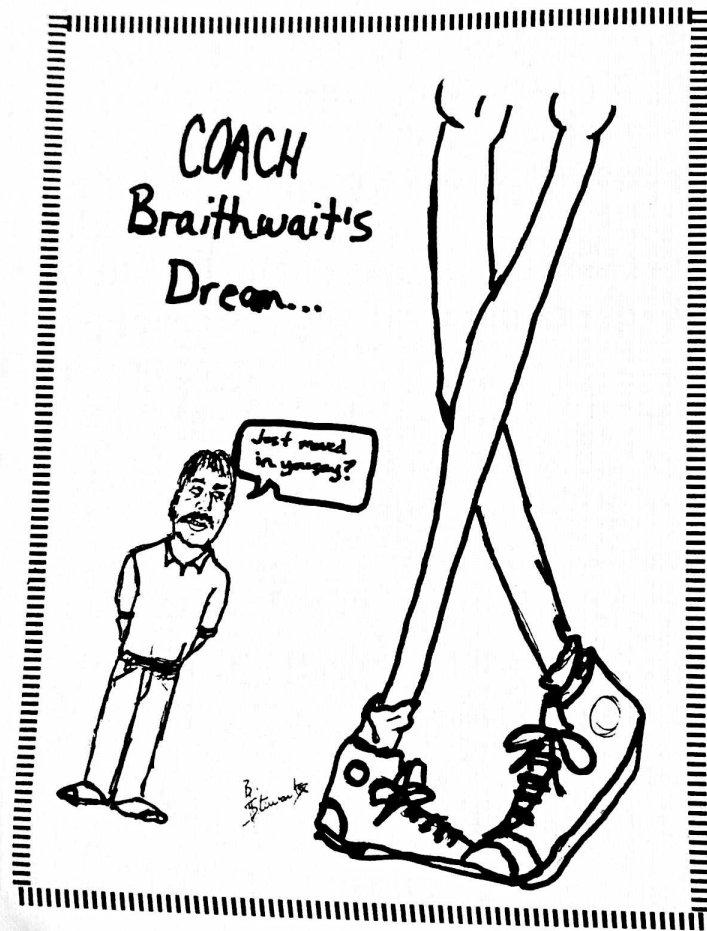

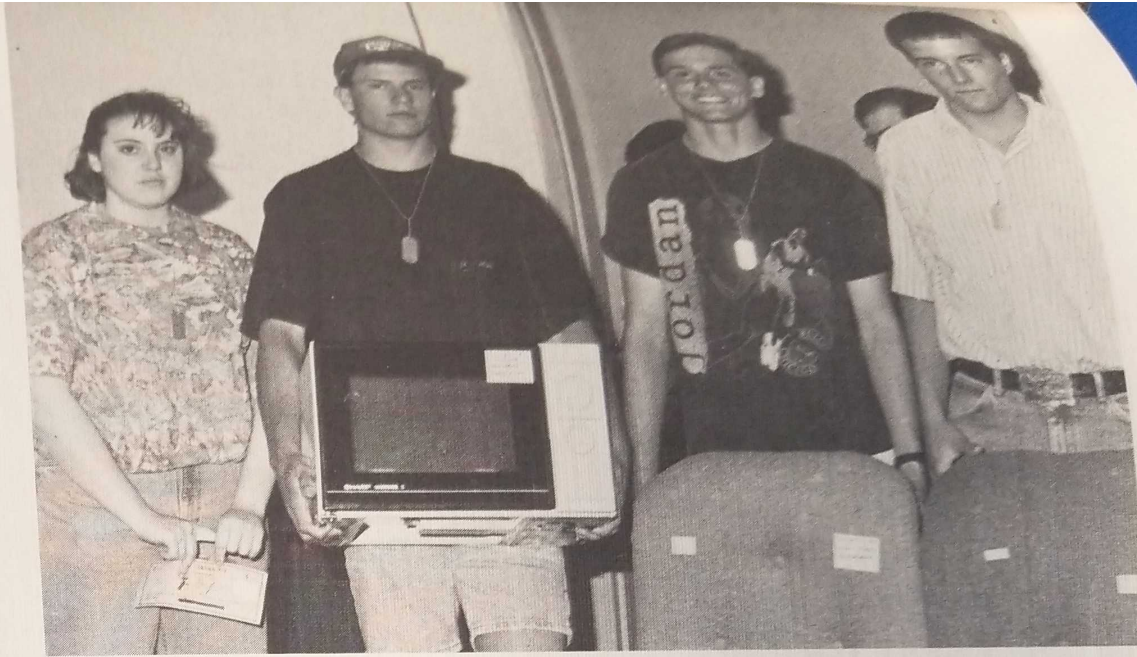
Late Night Life

After a few hours of dancing at prom, some 86 students attended the post prom party, MASH BASH.

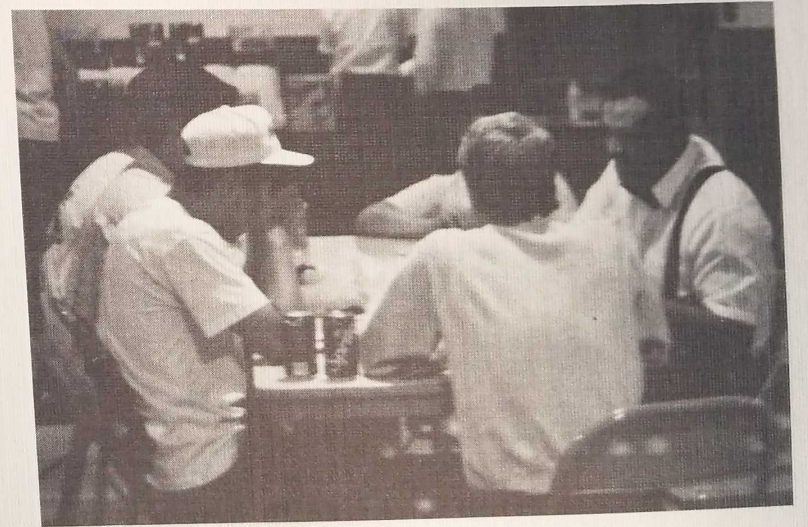

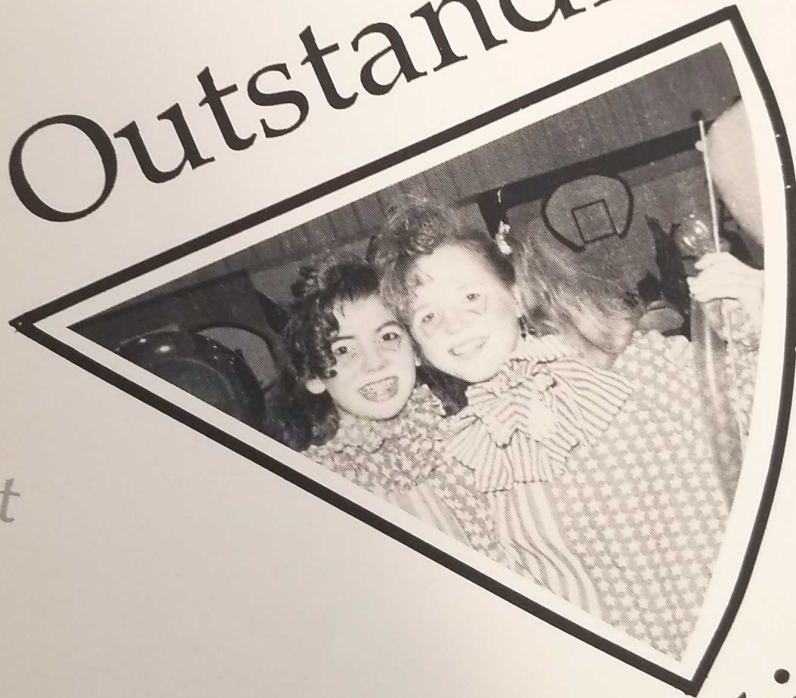

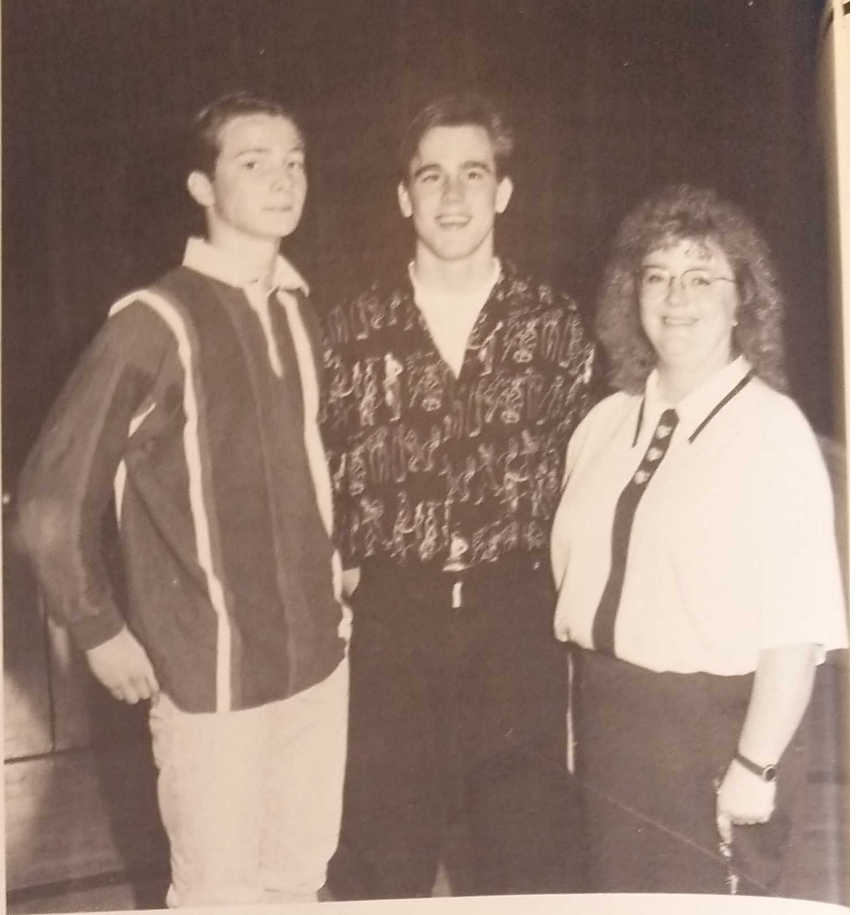

The camp was held at the University in Lincoln. The squad received a superior trophy and eleven ribbons consisting of outstanding, superior and excellent.

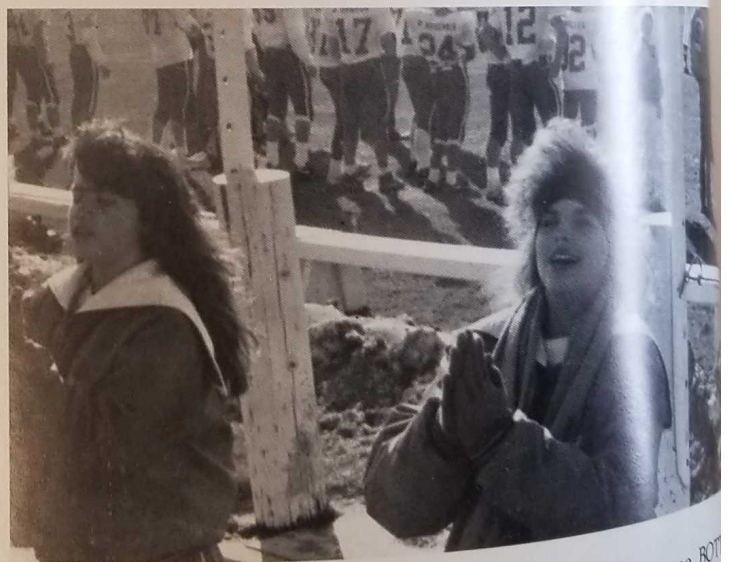
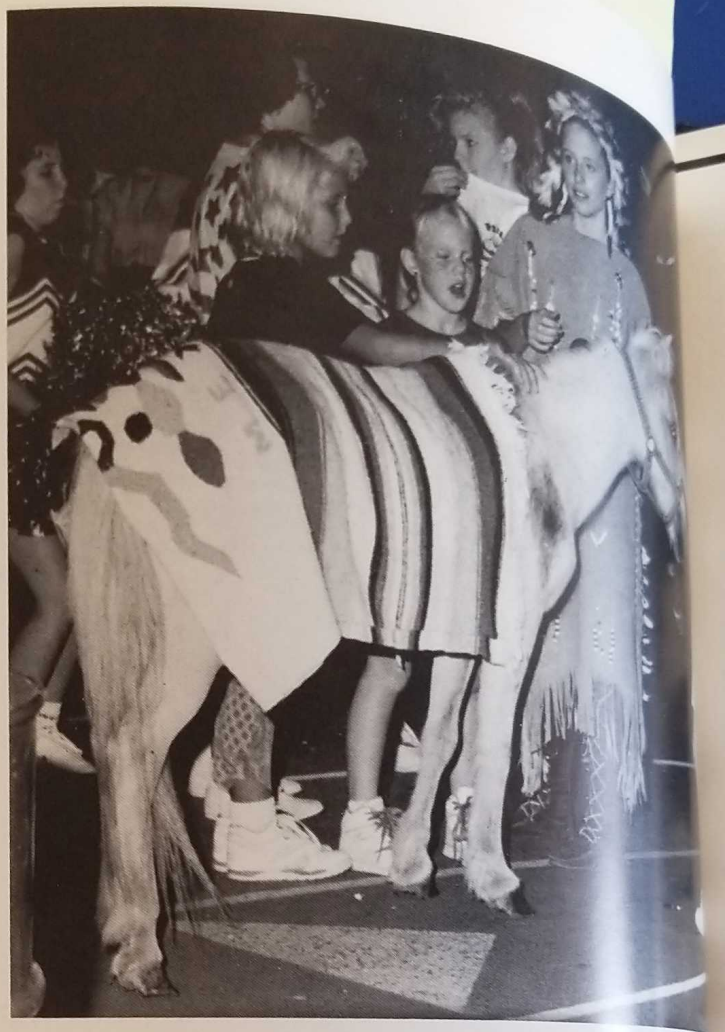

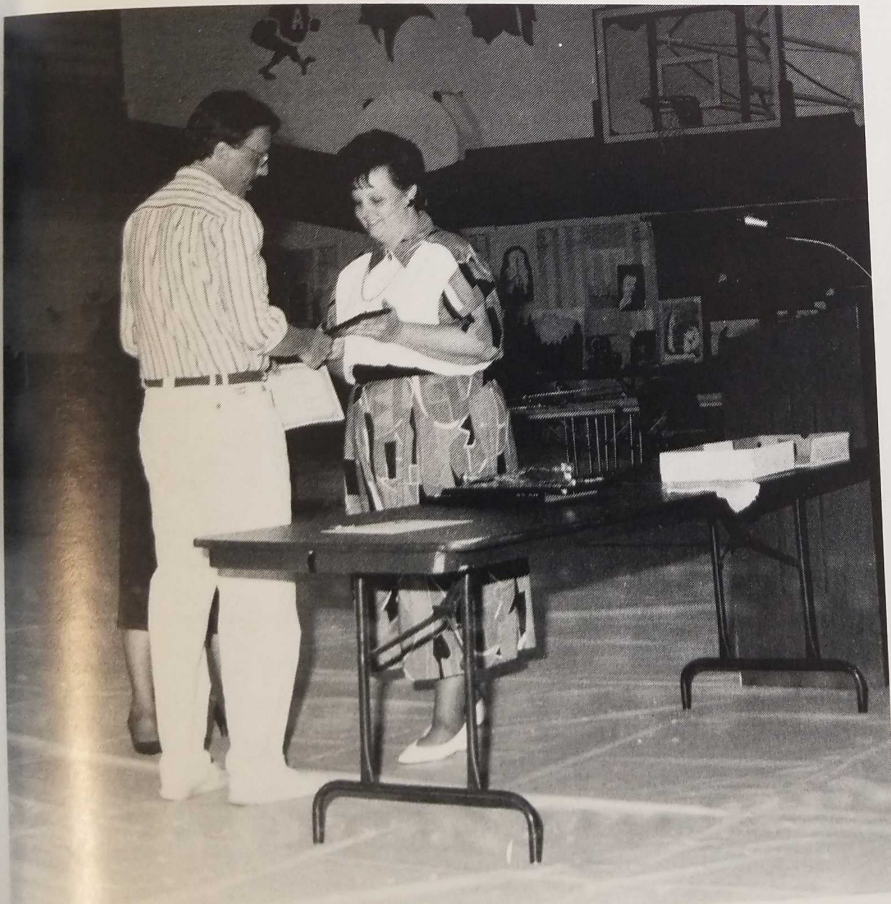

Outstepping at several home sports contests, the Drill Team entertained the Arapahoe and opposing spectators.

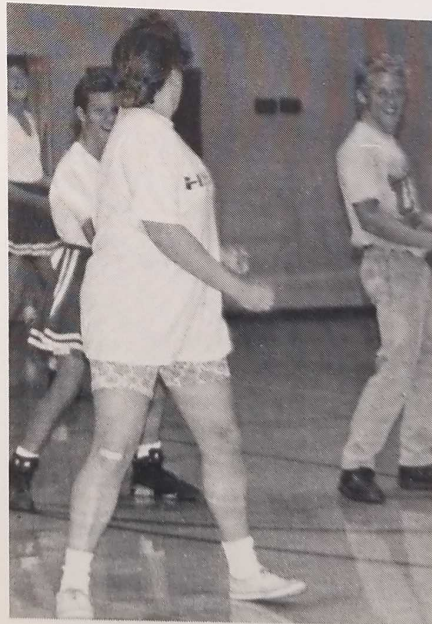

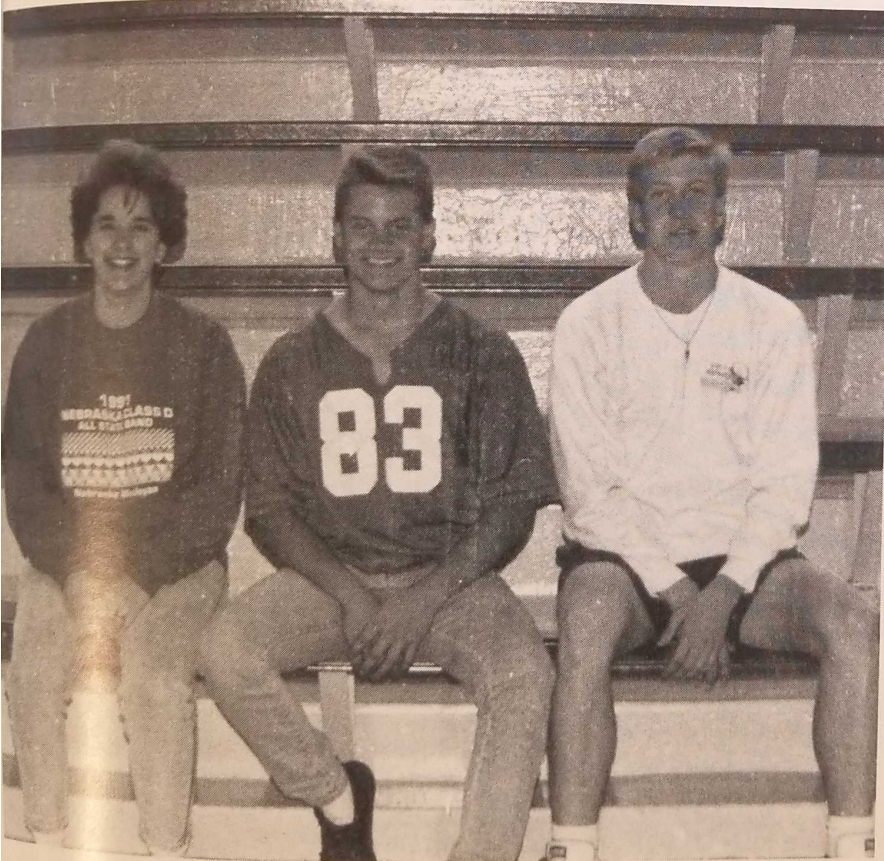

Oustanding achievements were made by Michelle Burton who placed first in Music and Casey Thompson placed first in Physics. Seth Haussler placed second in English Usage.

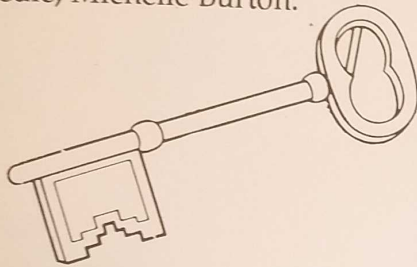

Casey and his mom enjoy a reception following the induction ceremony.

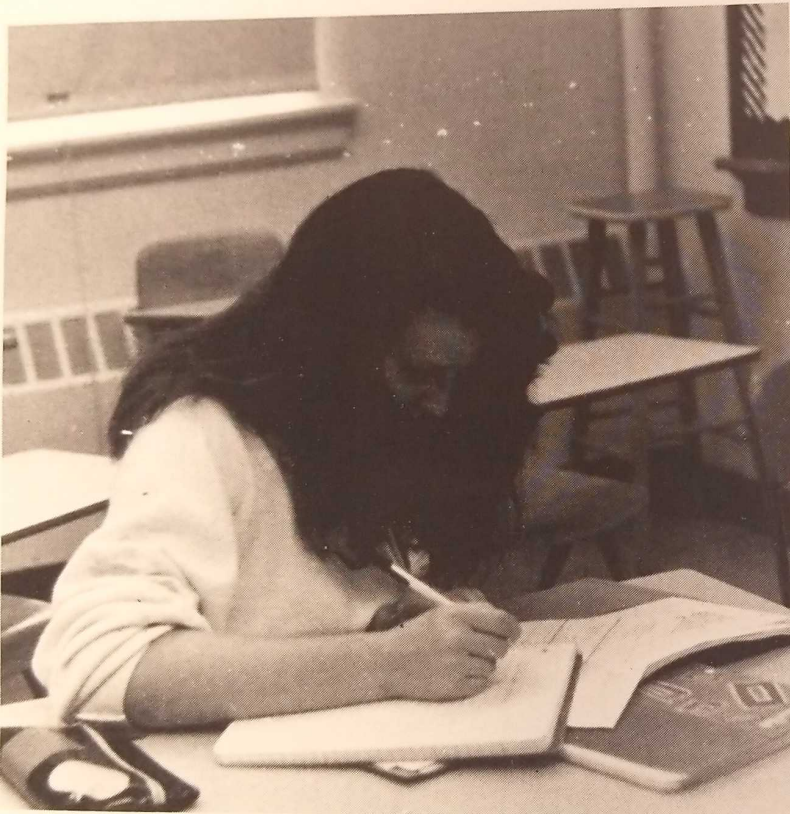
Out of Print

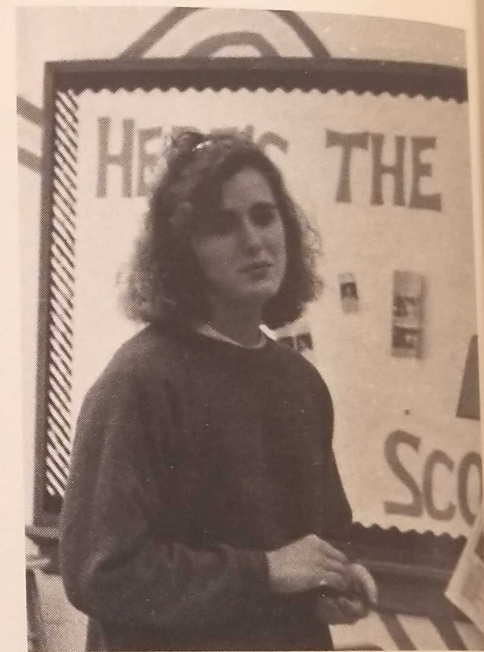

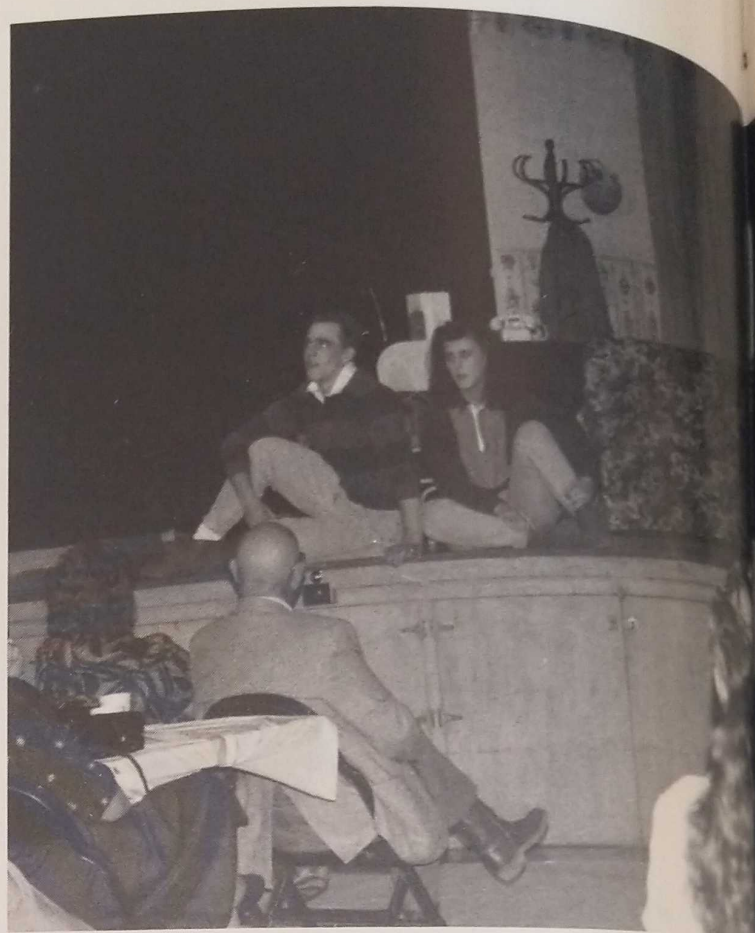
Outrageous Comedy

Twelve juniors and seniors made up the cast and the remaining students worked behind the scenes.

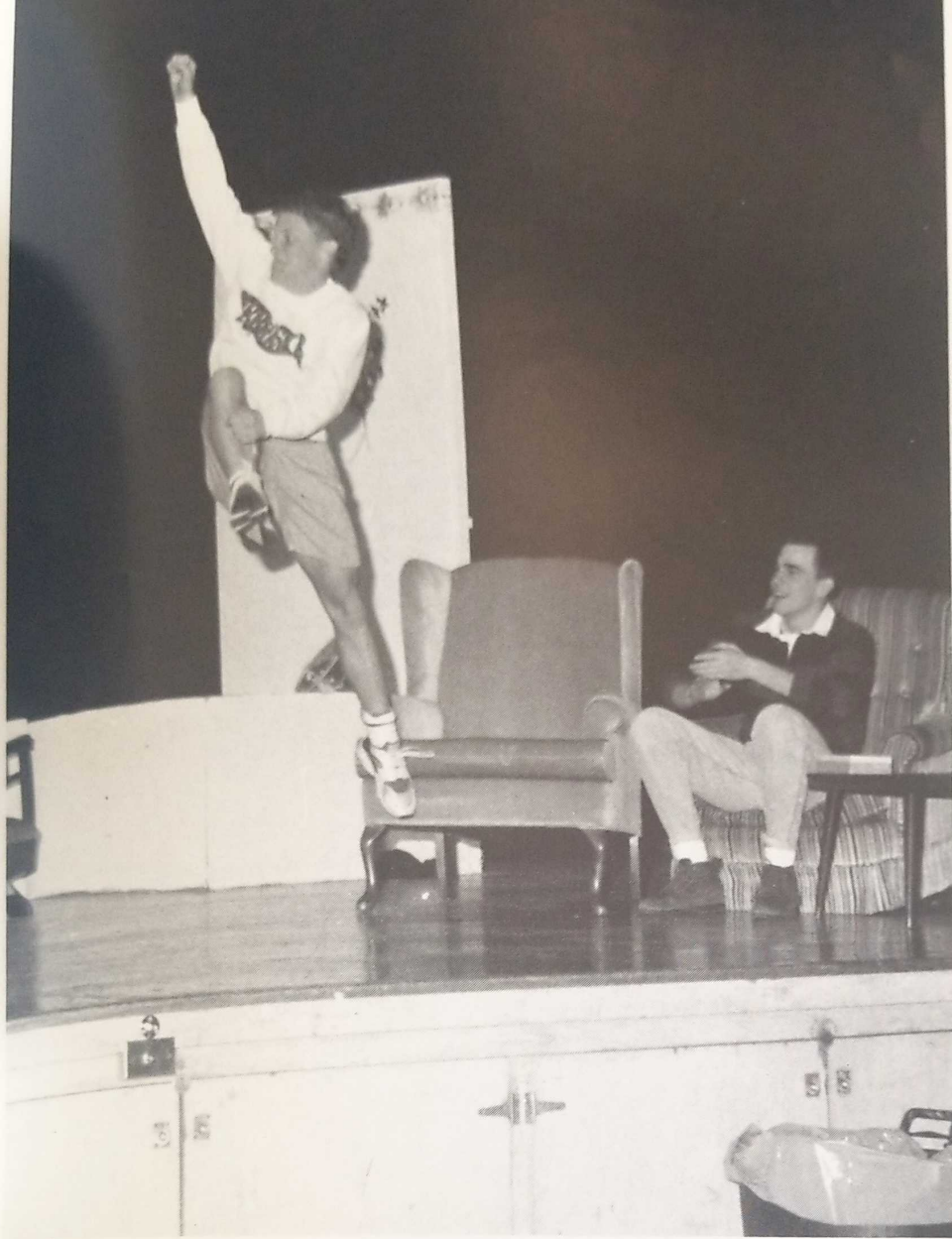

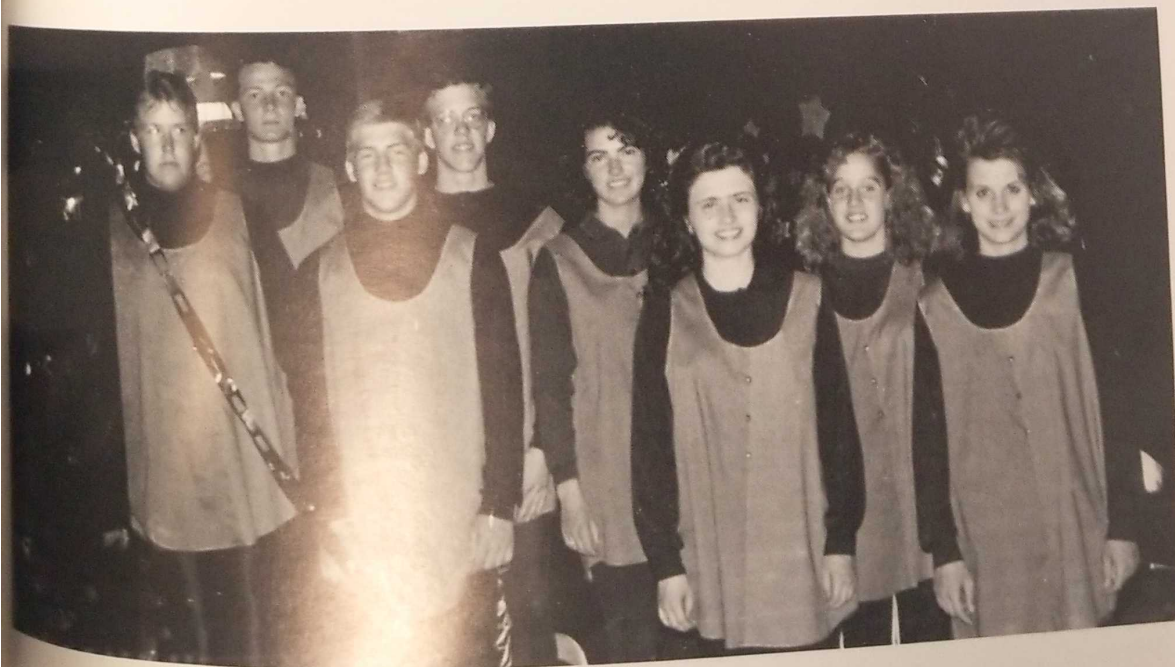

Outdoors soaking up the Ozark rays was a place 23 AHS seniors could be found on their stay at Kirkwood Lodge.

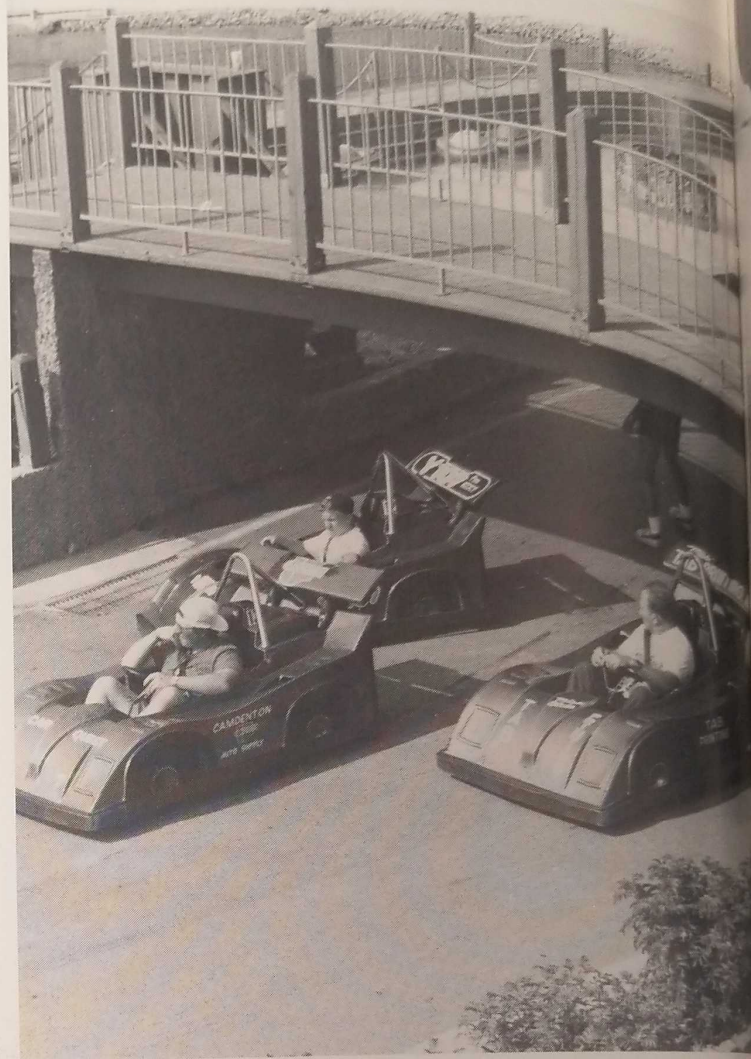

The evenings were spent dancing and socializing with seniors from other schools.

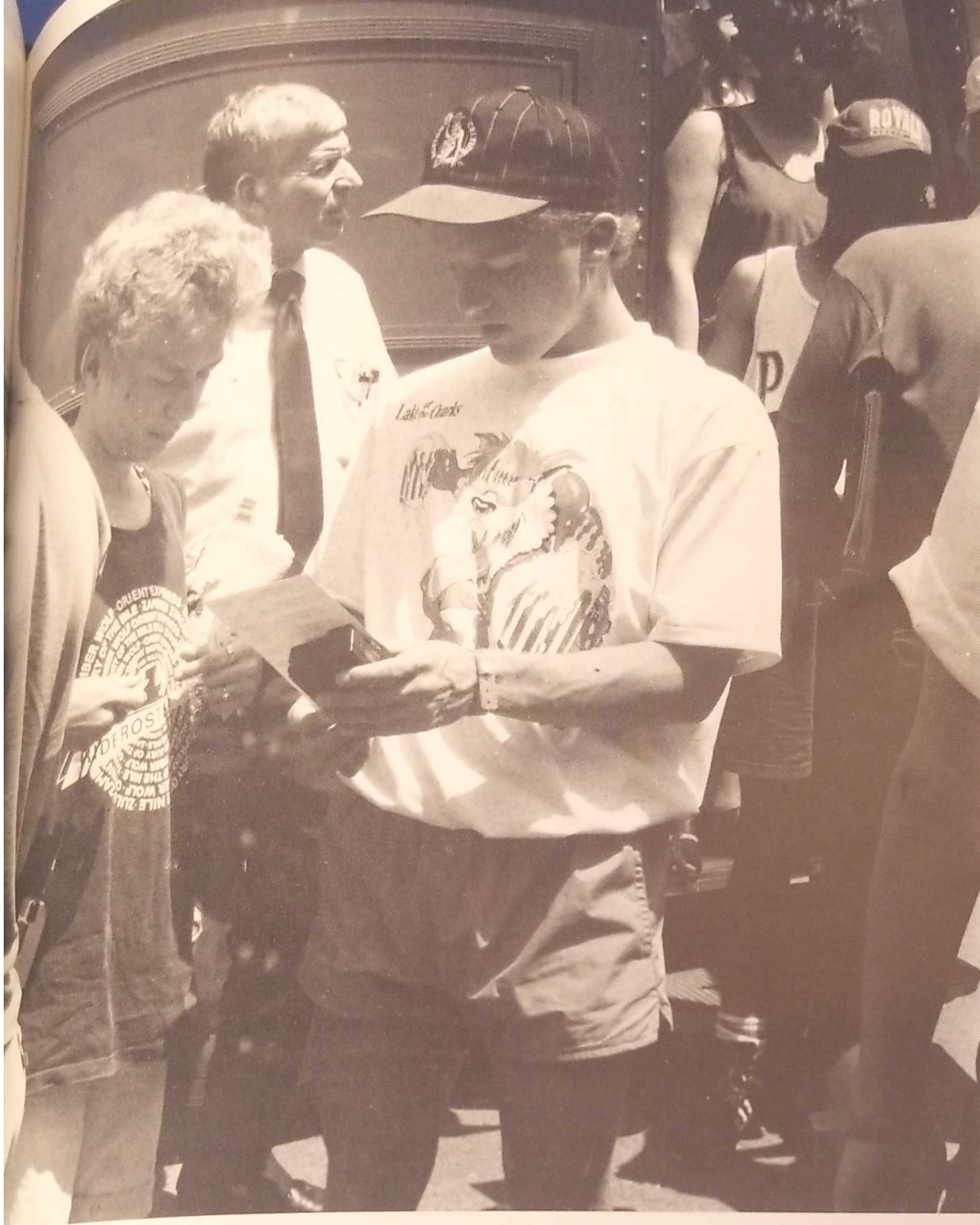

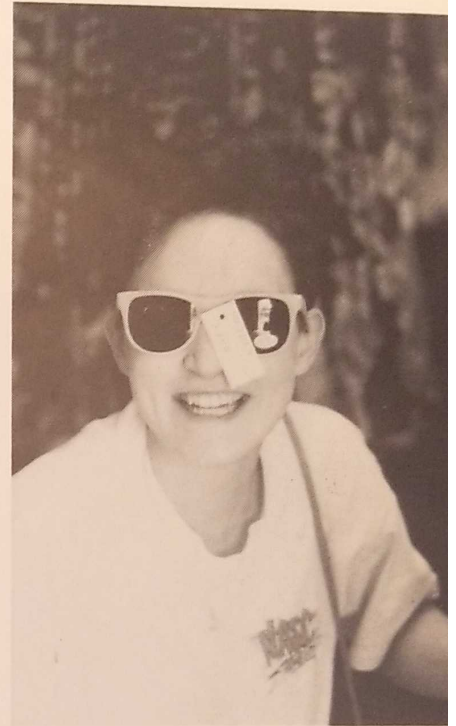

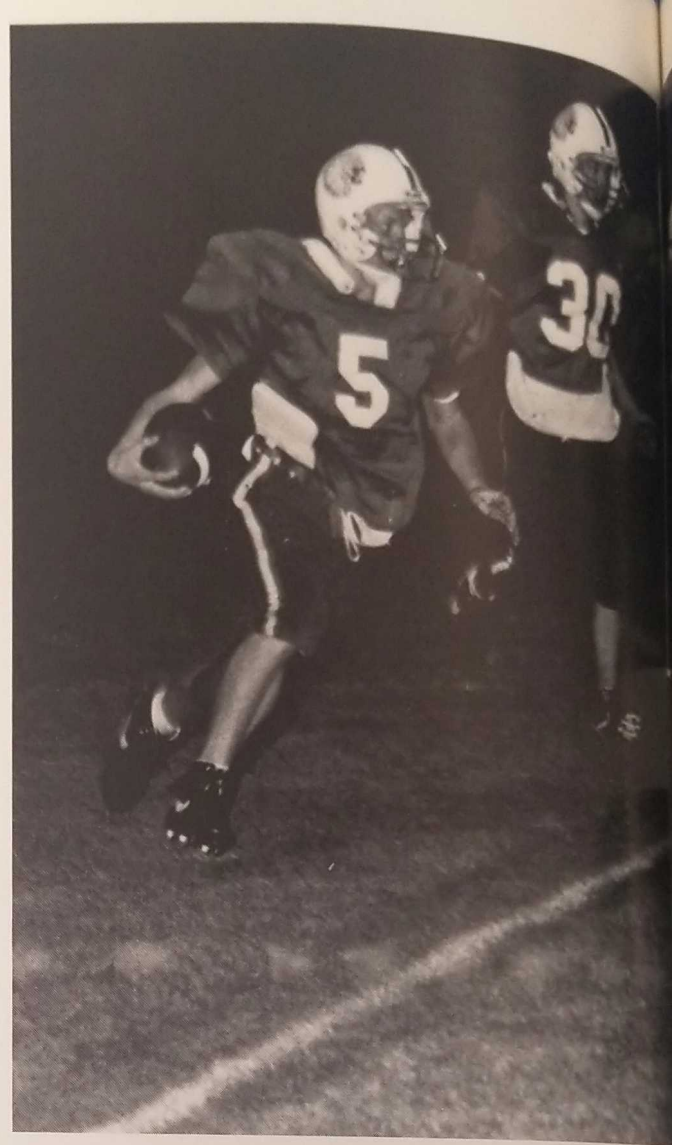
Out of Sight

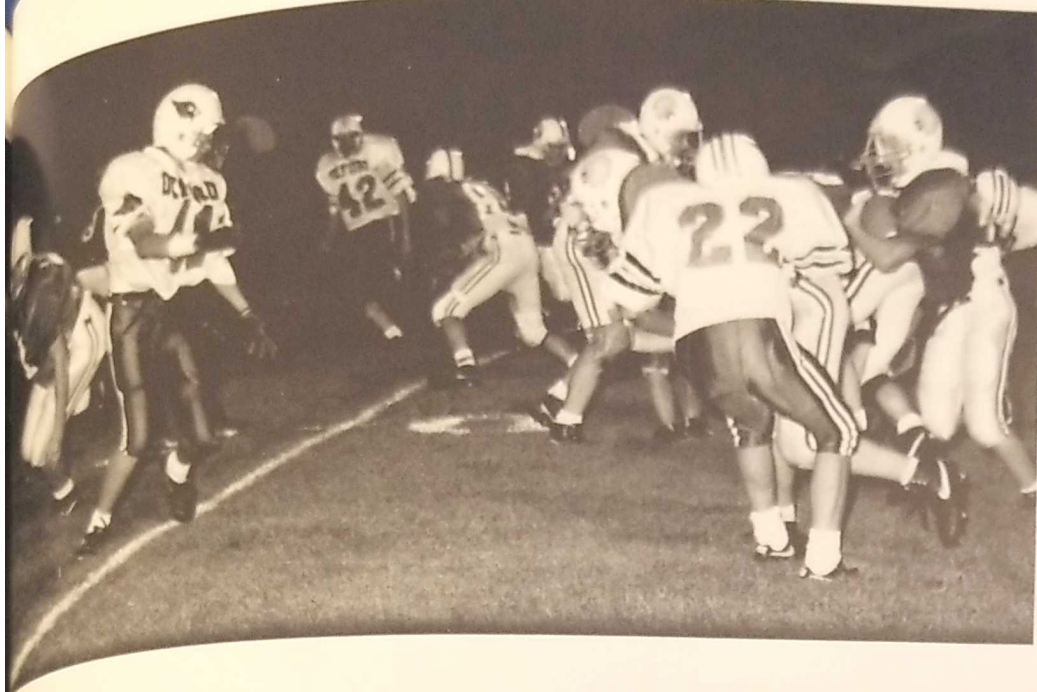

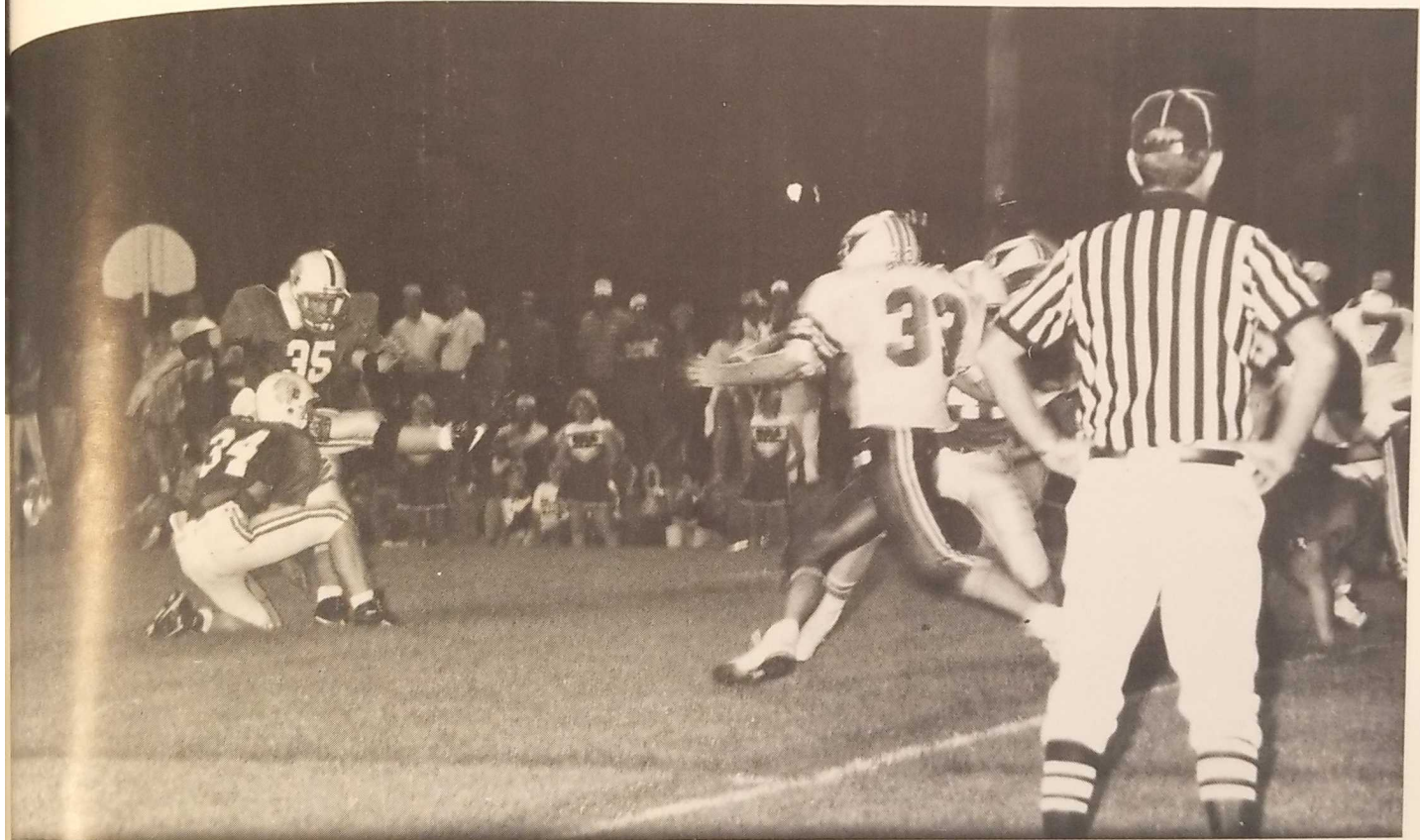

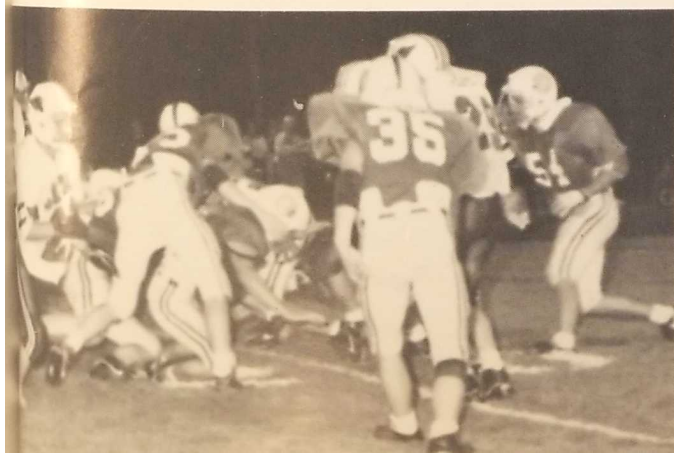

Sarah Ahrens achieved All Conference honorable mention.

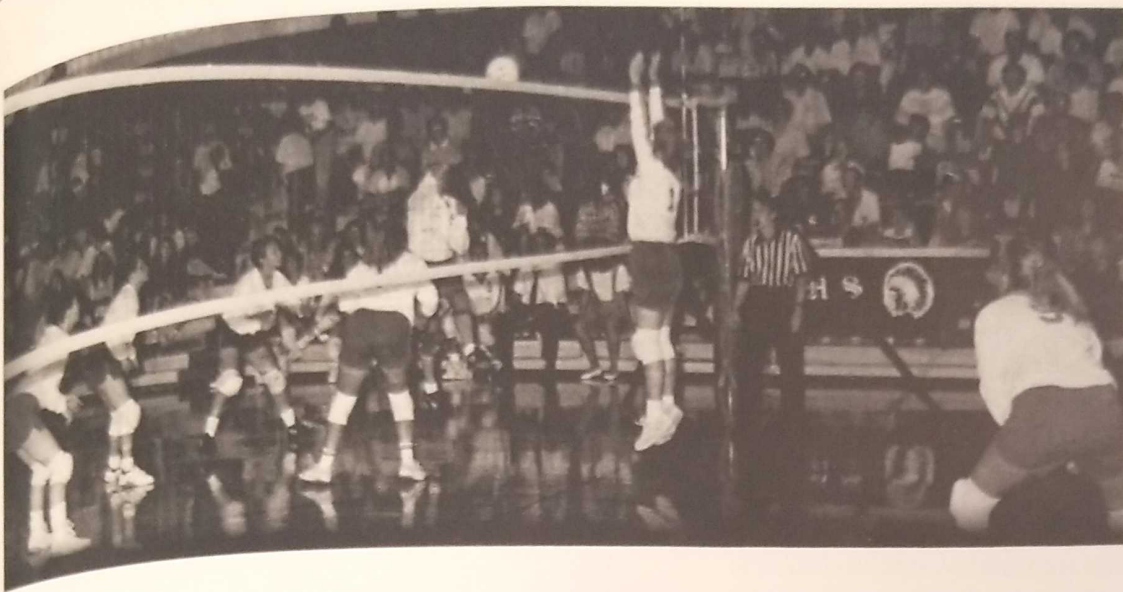

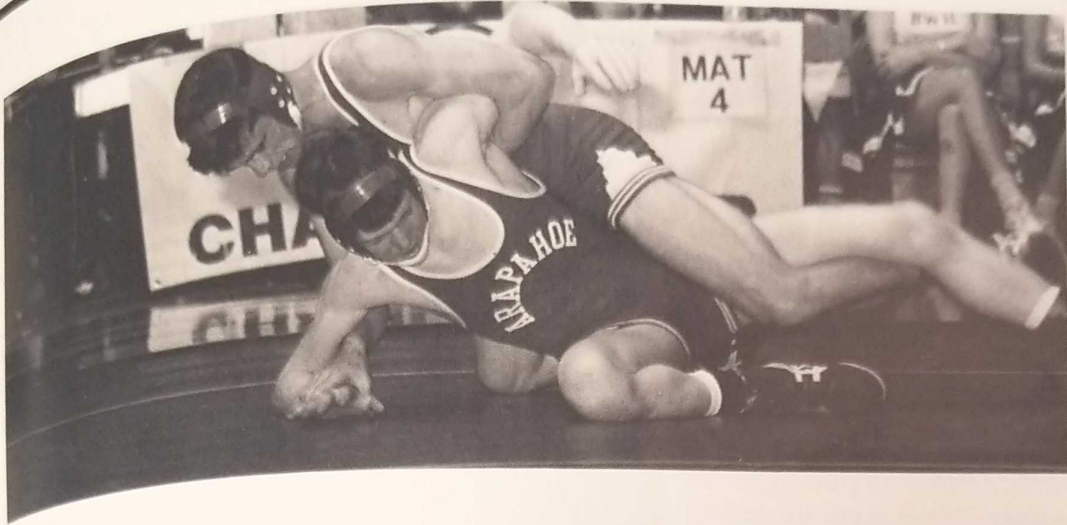

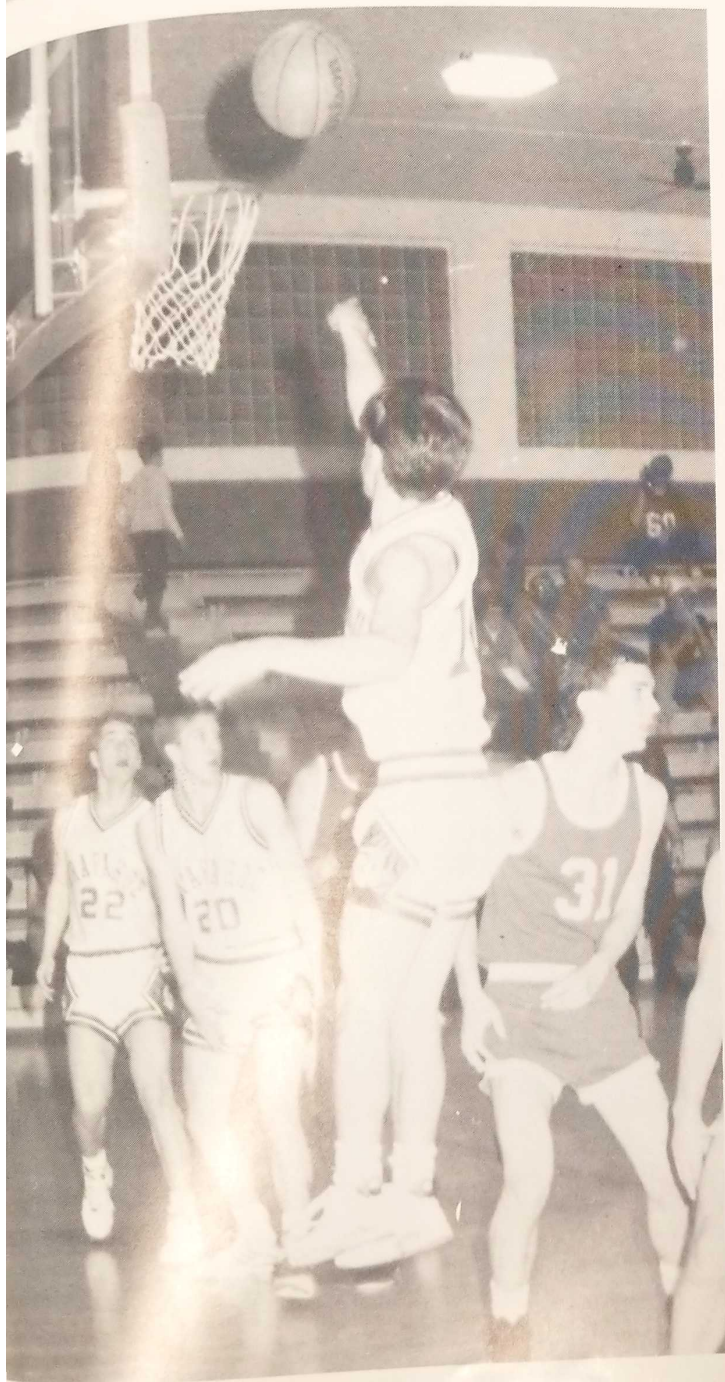

Outscoring six of their 17 opponents, the Warrionette Basketball Team had their best season in six years.

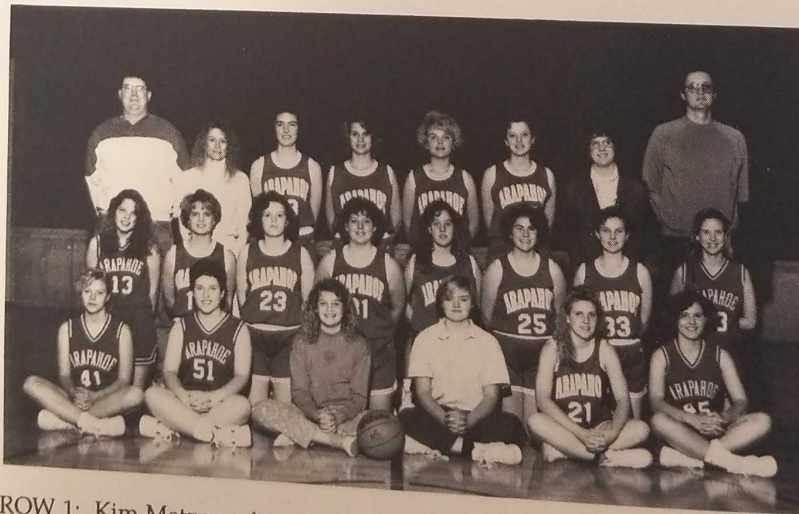
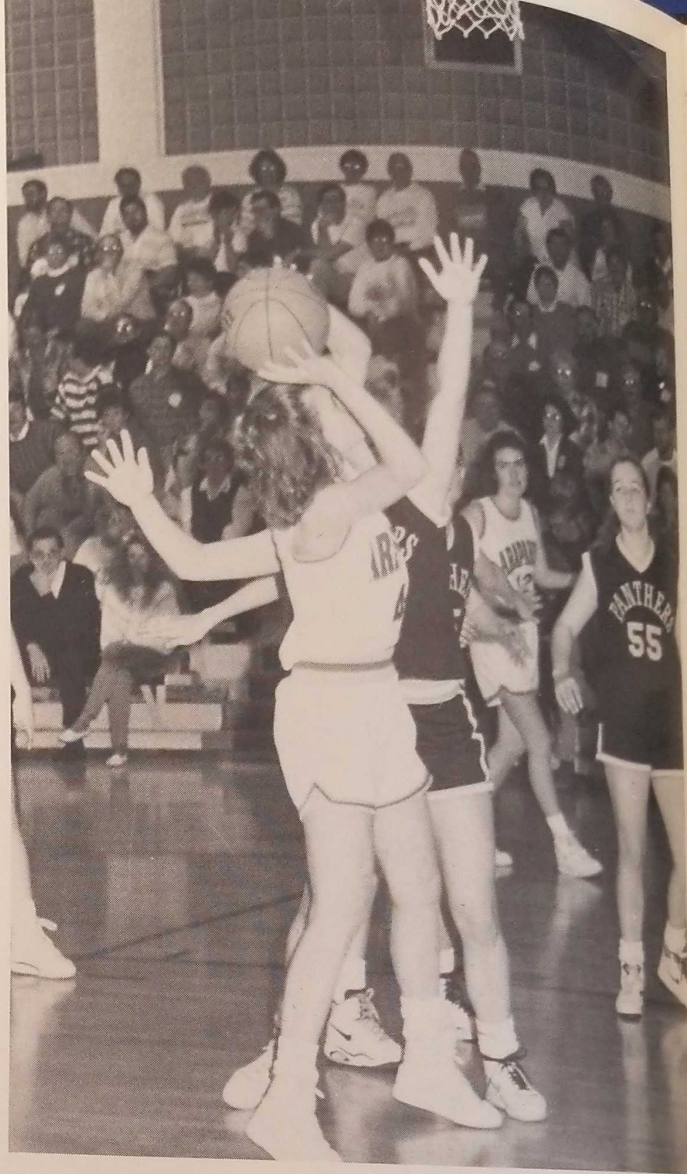

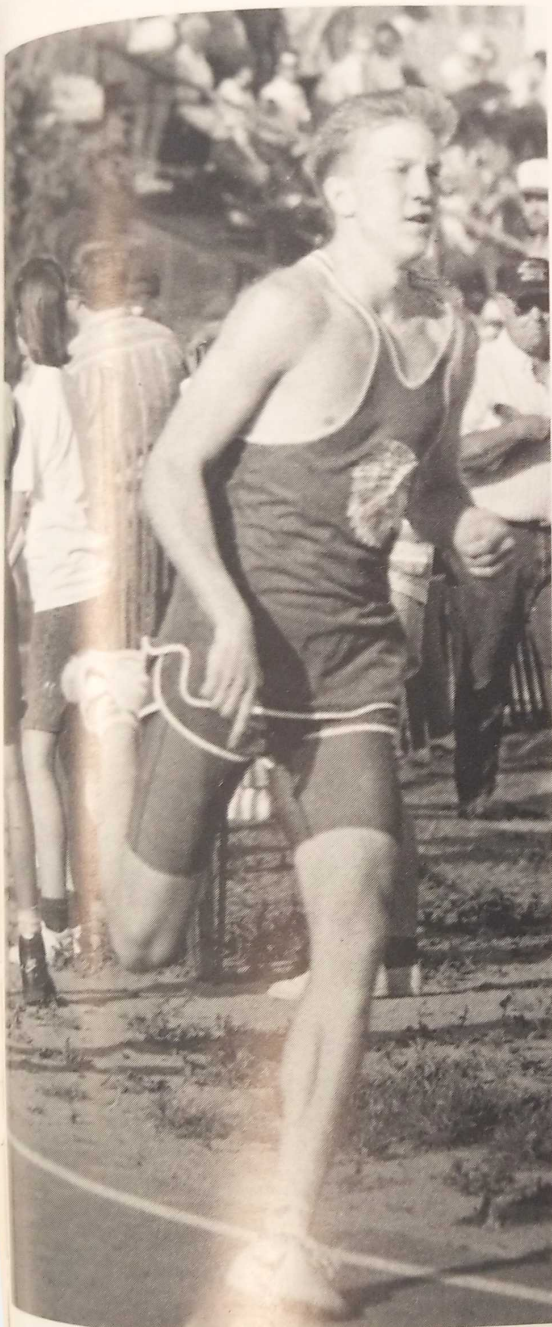

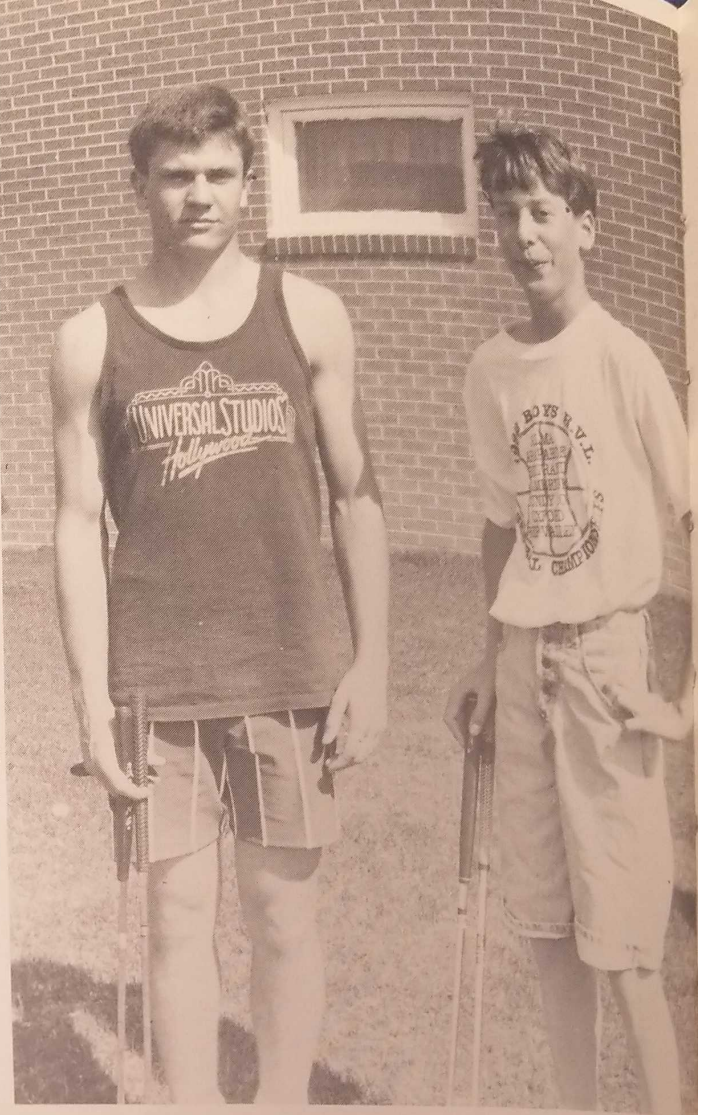
Out on the Green

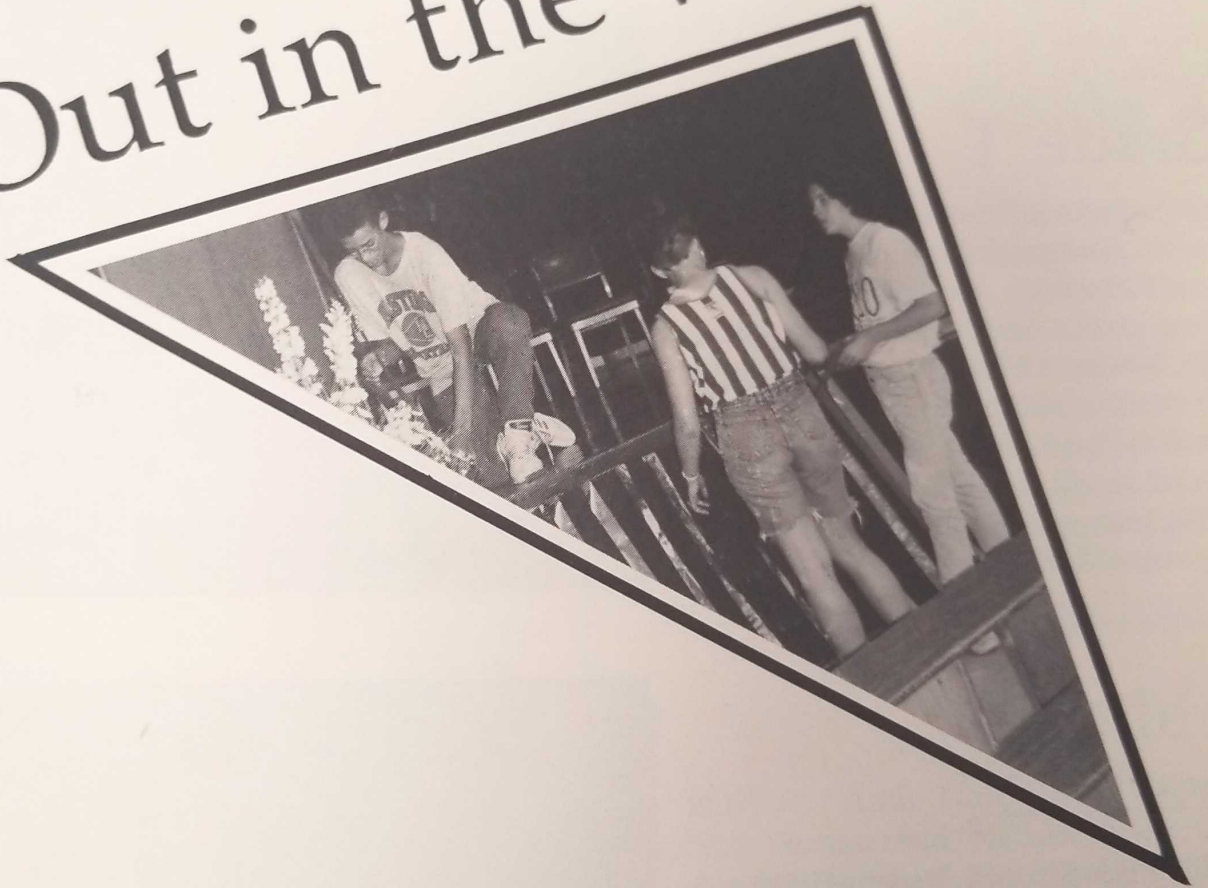

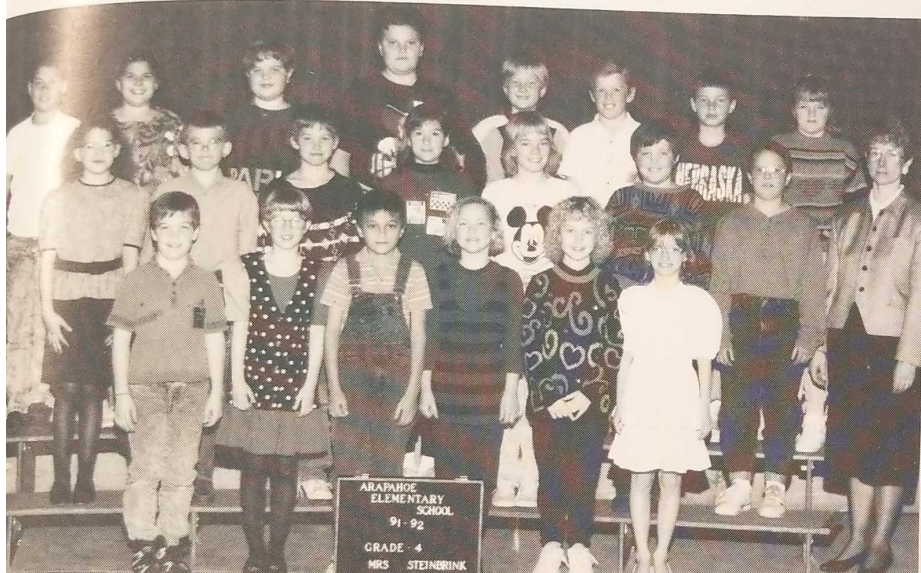
