WARRIORS DEFEAT ALMA

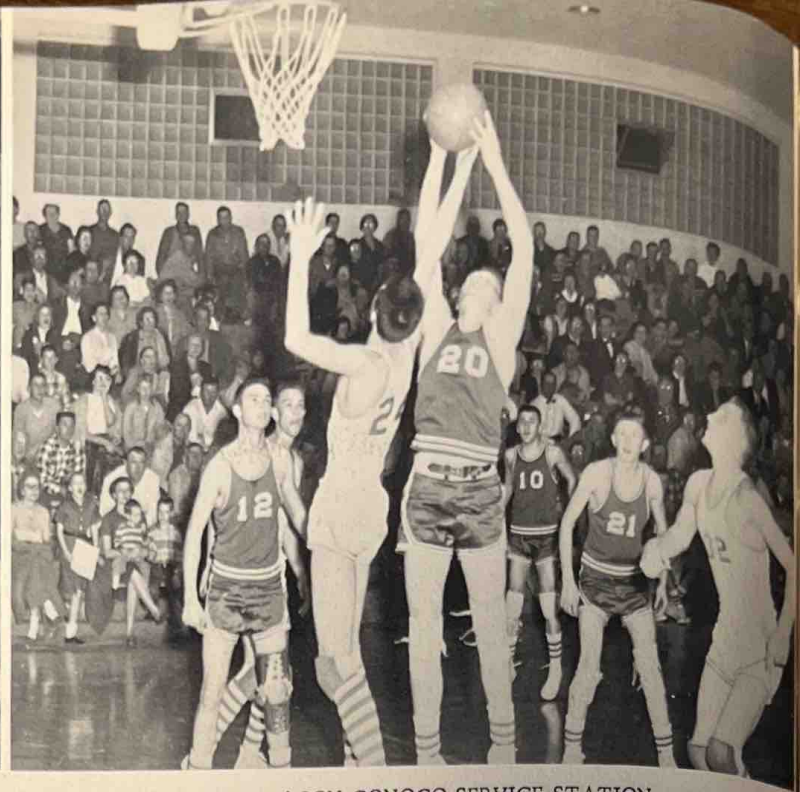
