The senior class excelled in scholastic ability and claimed Arapahoe's record for having the most students in a class on the Honor Roll.



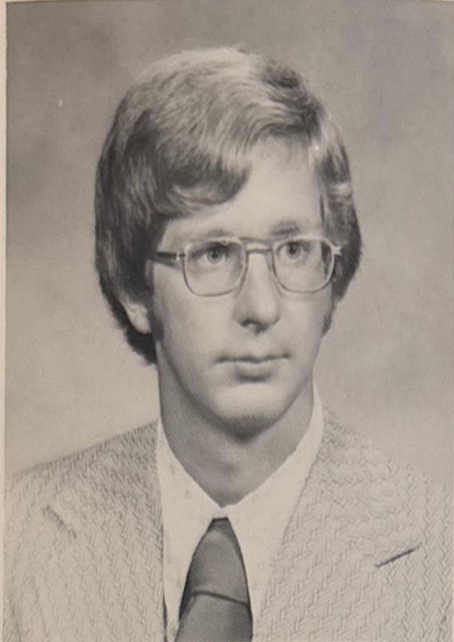
