The AHS Junior Class experienced many new things throughout the year. One of the most time consuming activities happened to be writing a term paper, and the topics proved to be very interesting.

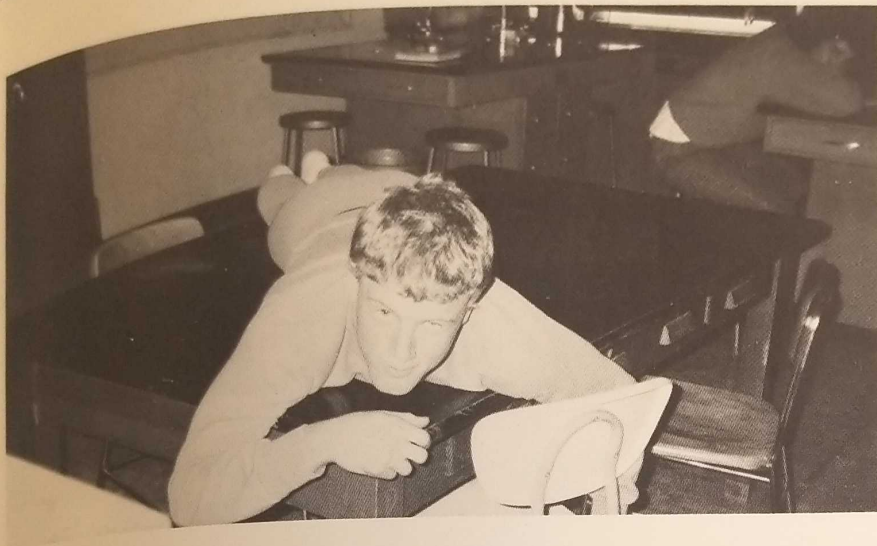
Some topics were Al Capone, The Salem Witch Trials, Auschwitz, the right to die and Malcom X. These gruesome topics were chosen by girls.

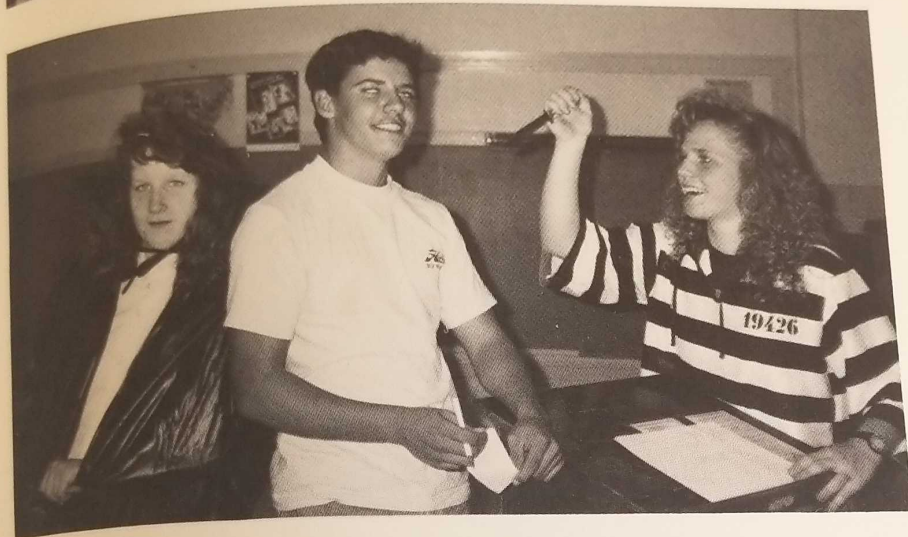
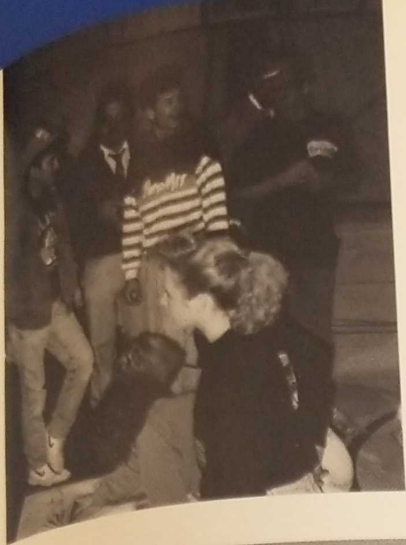
"The good thing about being a sophomore is that I don't have to worry about college yet," was the comment of Jill Huxoll, 90/91 sophomore.

And, yes, they could put their energy in other activities--like biology. One time an unpleasantly smelling turtle made them turn around and leave the room. Who didn't clean it?

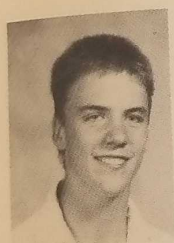

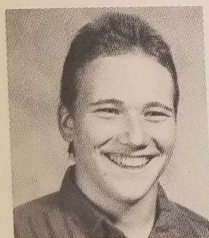

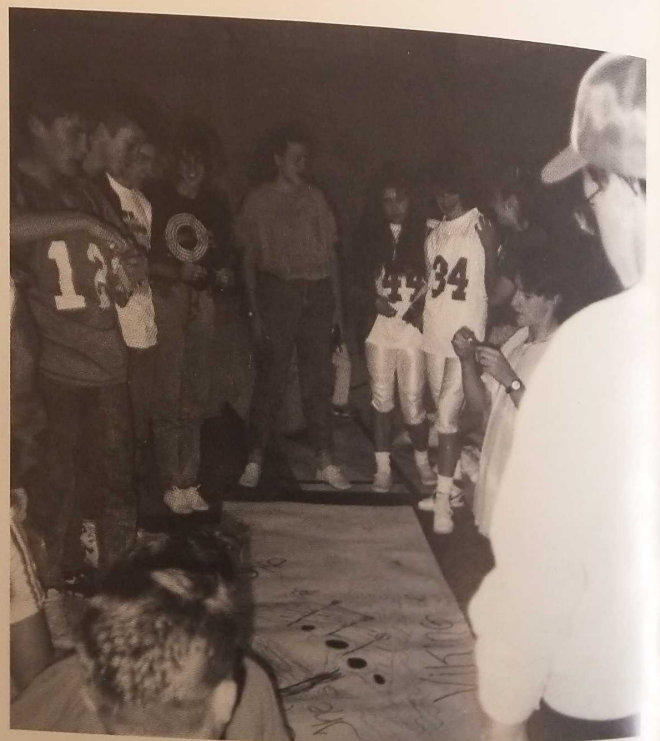


Bossing elementary kids around and getting away with almost anything made the 1990-91 Freshmen Class feel really powerful in Junior High, but now as freshmen it's a different story.

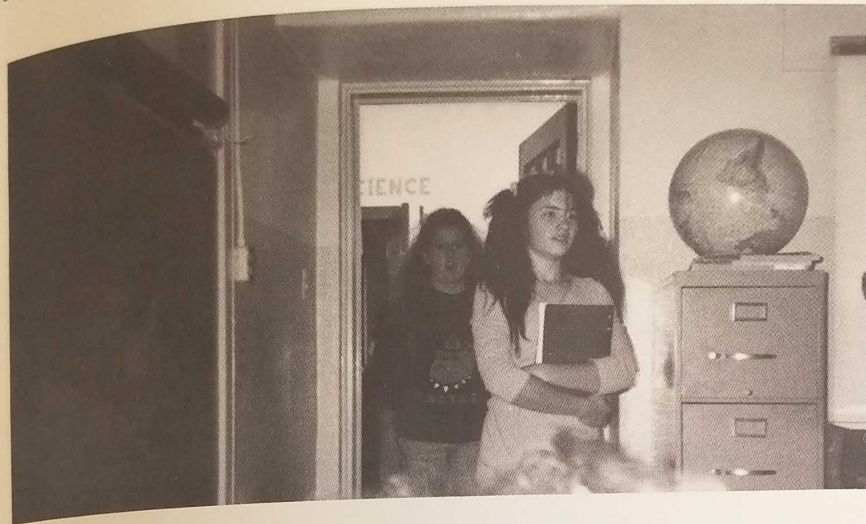
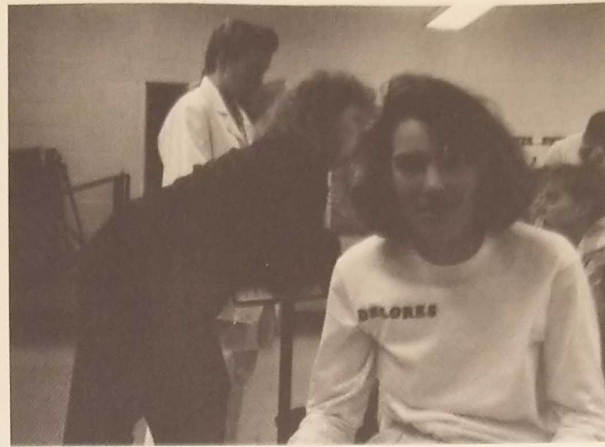
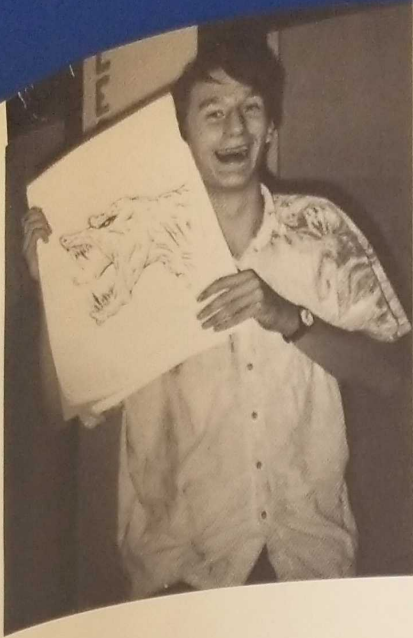
Back on the bottom of the totem pole the freshmen have to start all over again to get back to the top, and with that comes a lot of hard work.

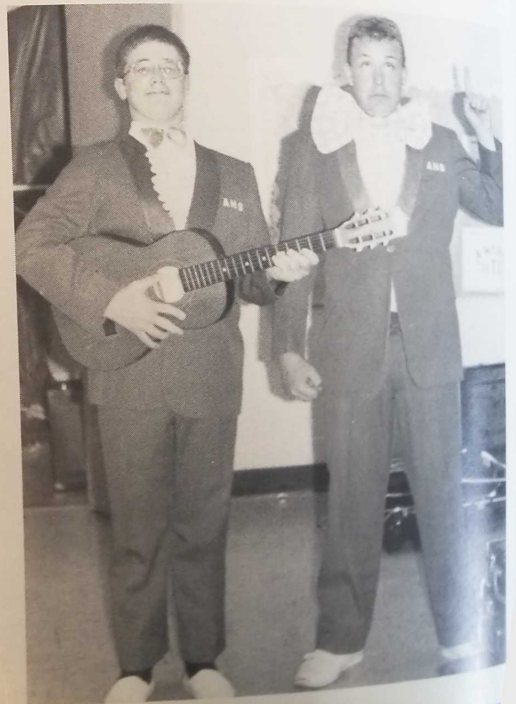
Band captures superior ratings

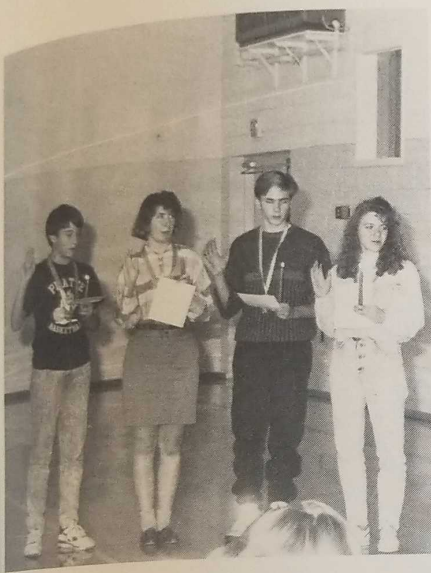

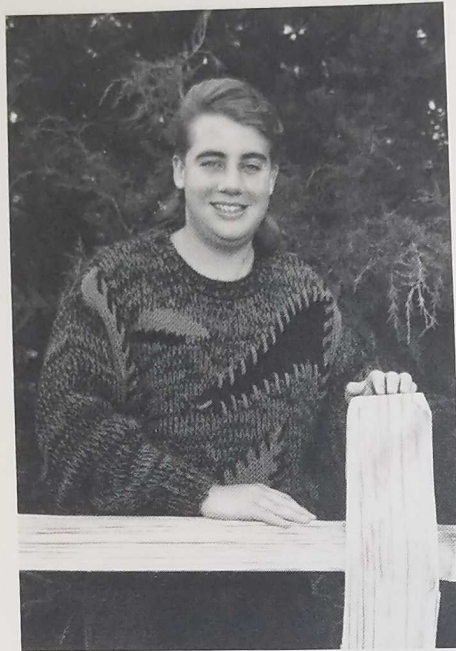

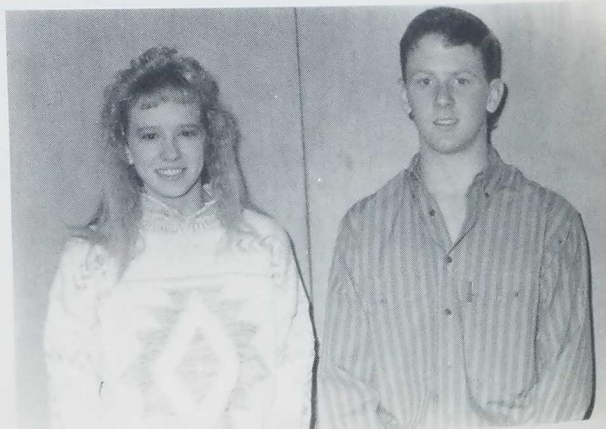
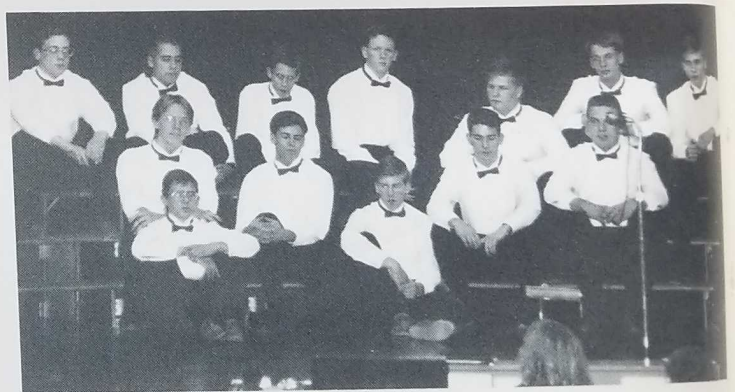
A pops concert complete with choreography was held in February. During their tour, the Hastings College Choir performed at AHS and worked with our choir on their selections.

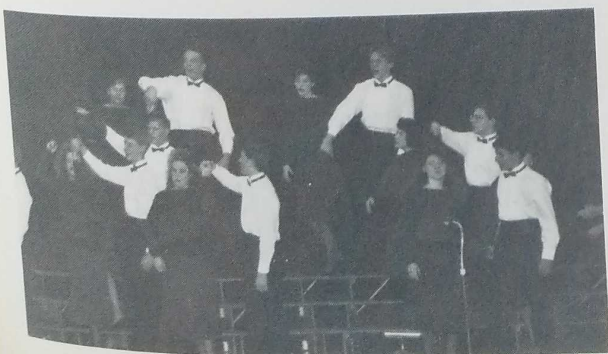

Hard work and dedication paid off for the Arapahoe FHA-Hero members as they were recognized as an honor chapter at State Convention.

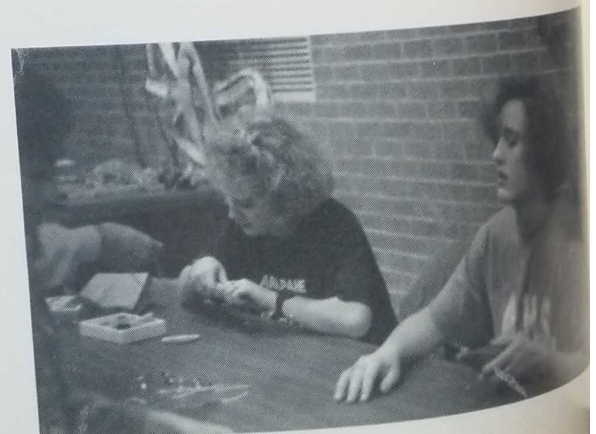

With the Winter Ball in February, the Student Council gave everyone an opportunity to dress up and come to a dance in the gym.

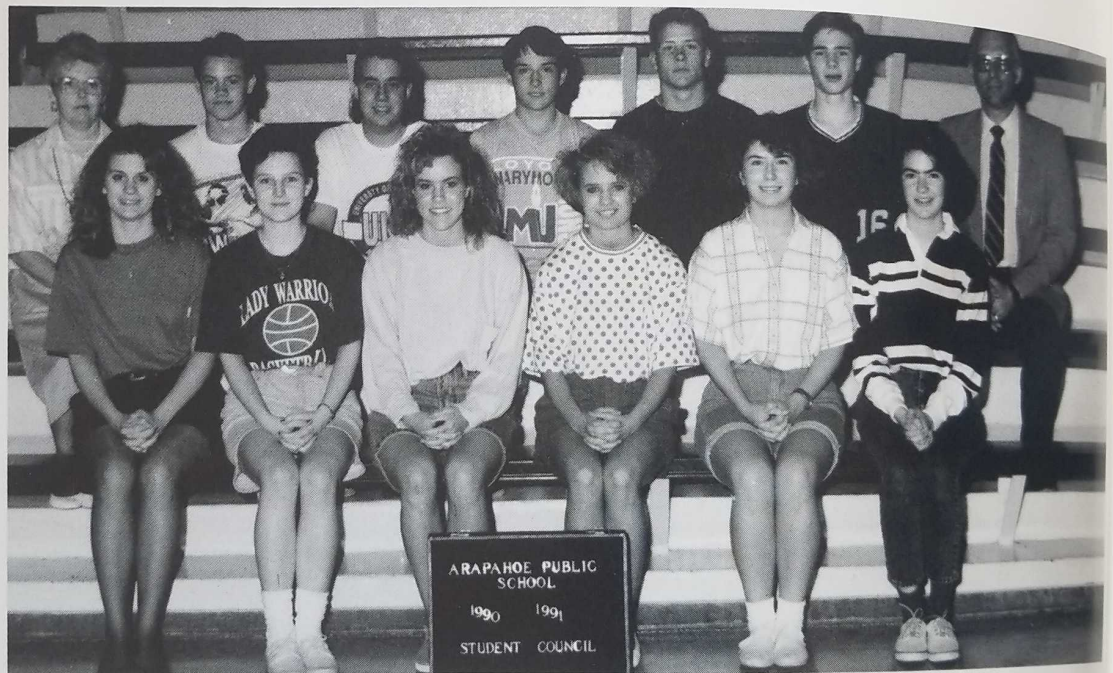
The study skills program is a project to help students to organize their time and

improve study habits. It will be continued next year with the help of Glen Powell from KSC.

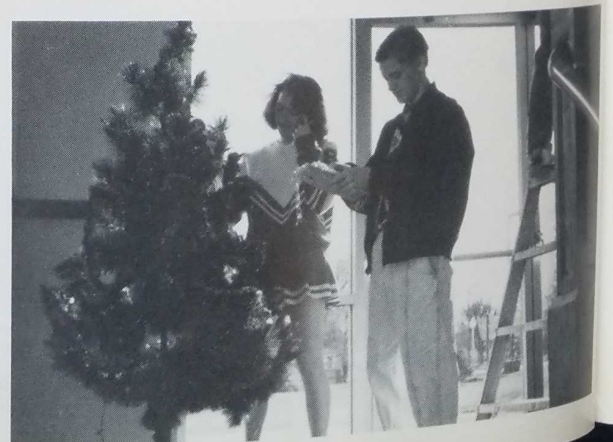
Pat Hurley was invited to AHS in April and he talked about current problems of young people in a humorous way. An evening seminar for parents was also provided.

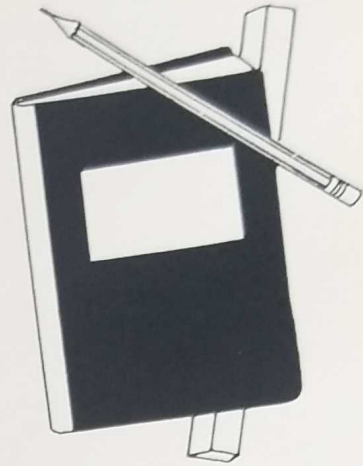
The Student Council also attended a state convention in Omaha and discussed their constitution.

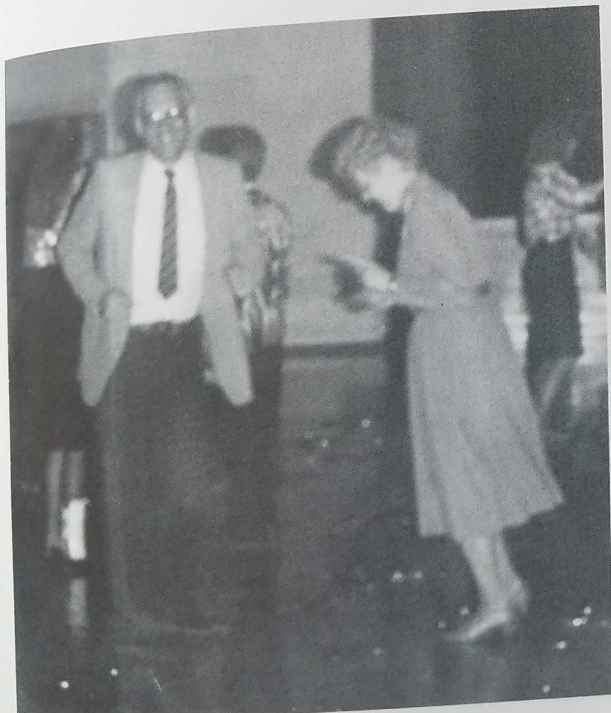

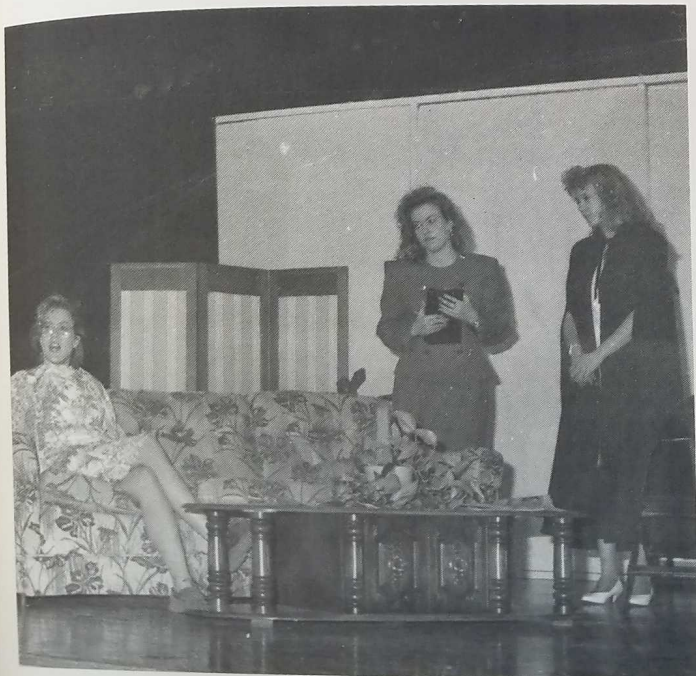
The events of the play took place in the home of Amanda Tillinghast, a very wealthy woman.

Once again the annual Inter-High Day was held at McCook Community College. Sixteen top students from AHS attended this year's contest. Over 30 schools participated.

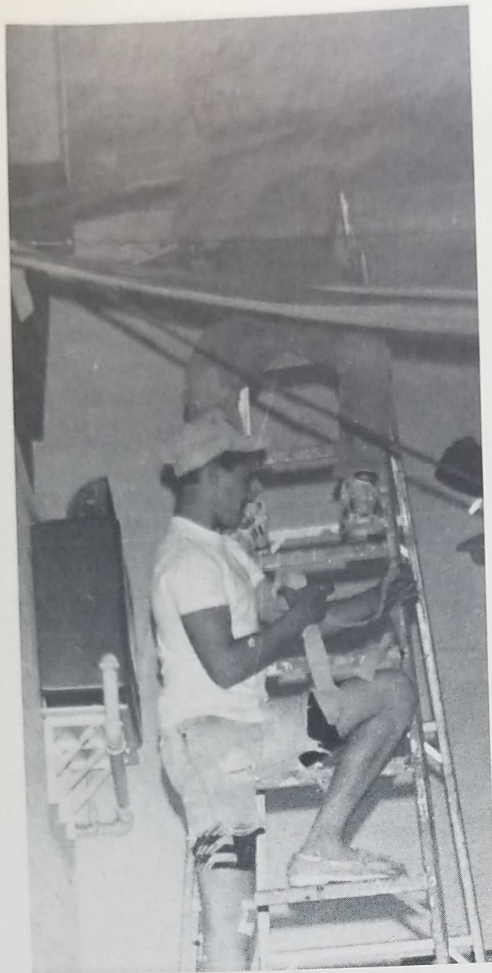
Out of the AHS participants, three finished in the top ten. Mickey Burton received the highest medal for Arapahoe with a second place finish in music.

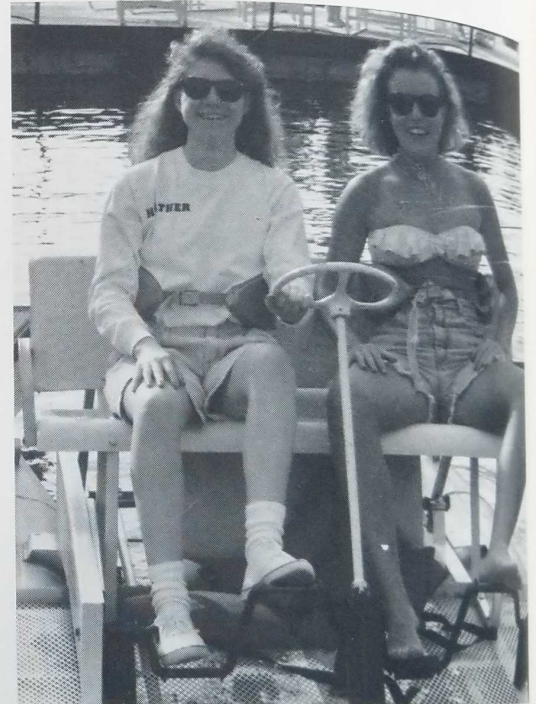
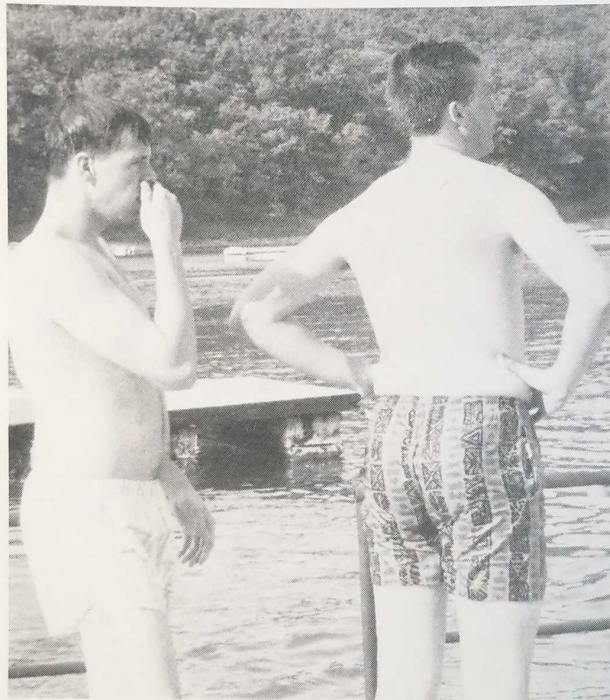

After two fun-filled, but tiring days the seniors boarded the bus for the 12 hour ride home Monday morning. By that time everyone was ready to come home.

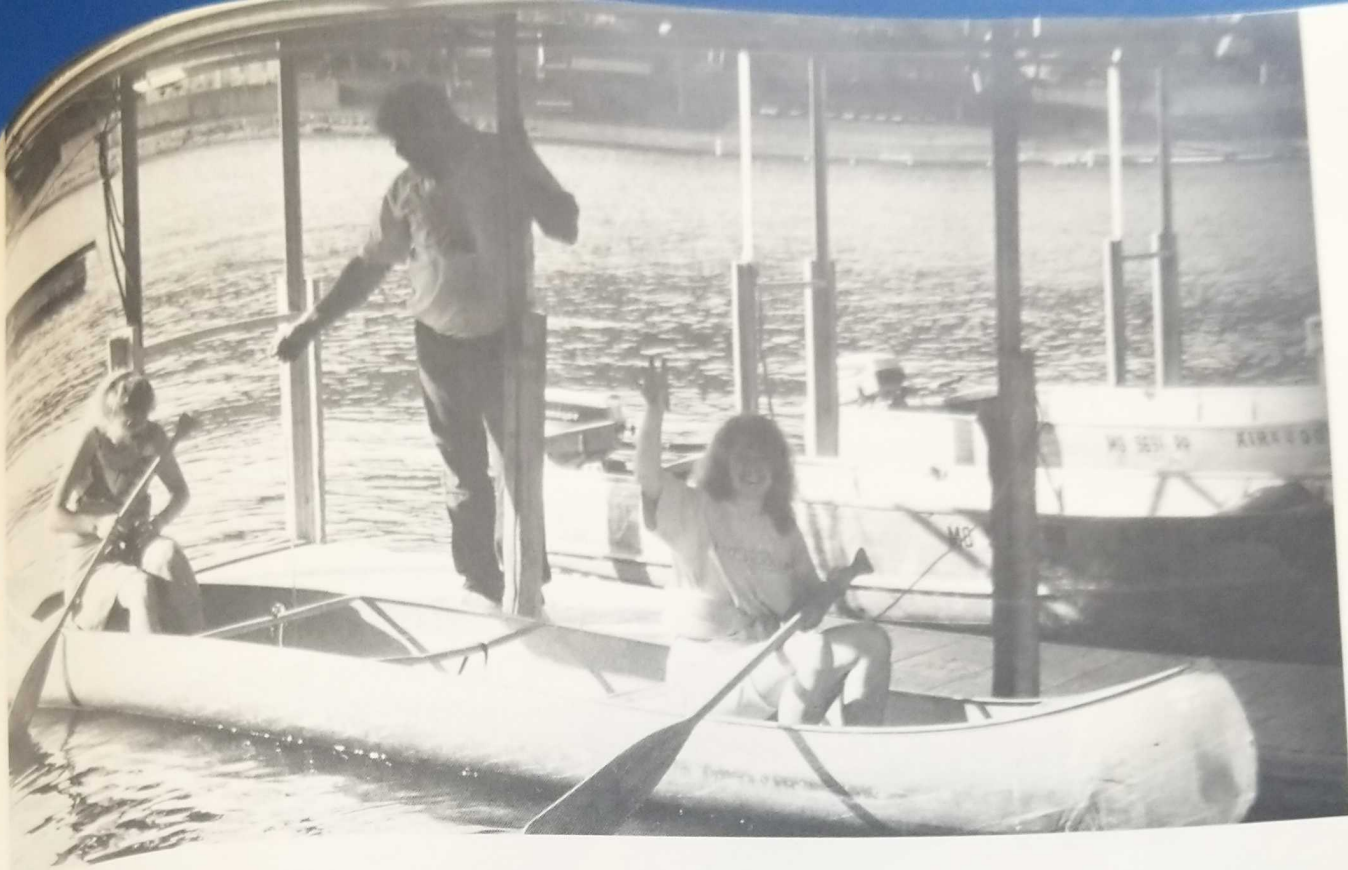

The 1990 volleyball season was hard fought as the Lady Warriors had a 5-10 season.

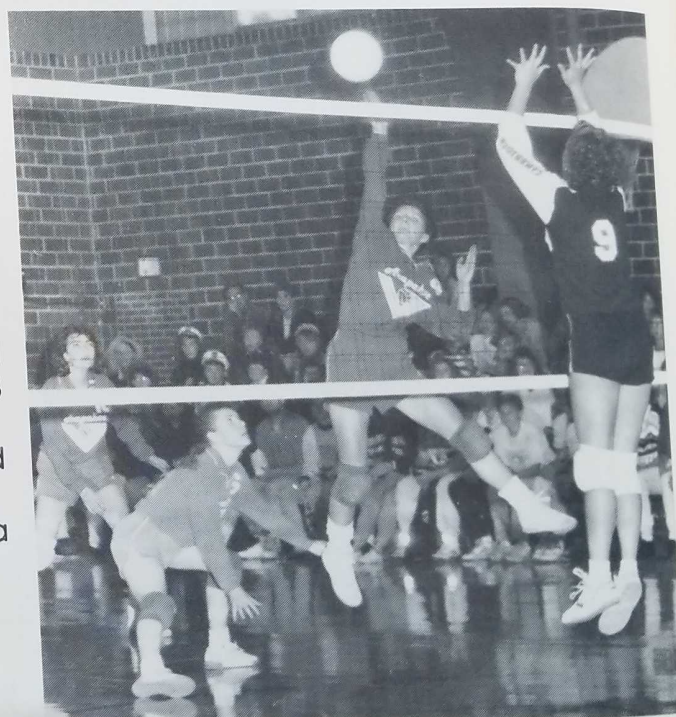

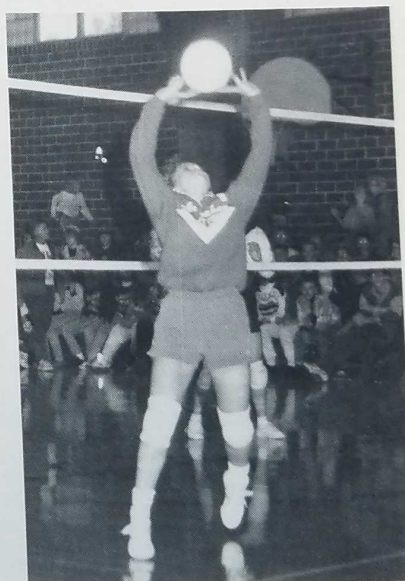

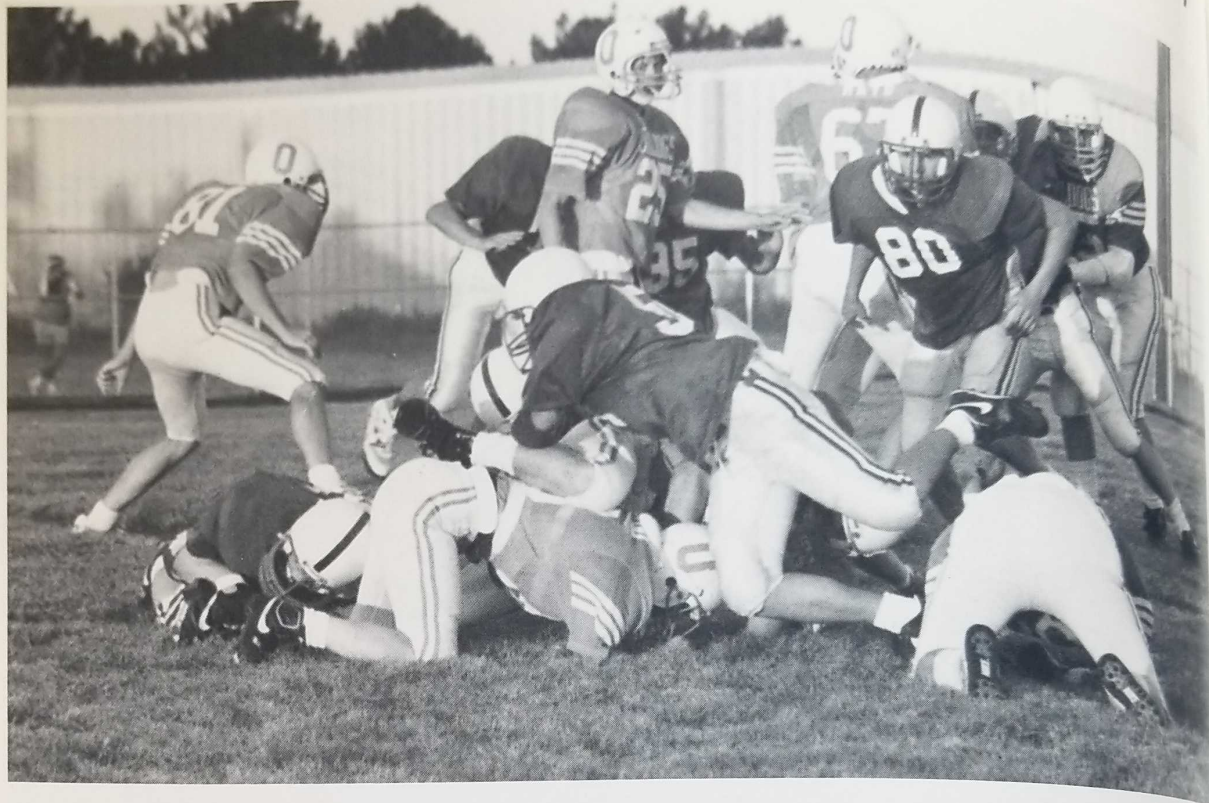

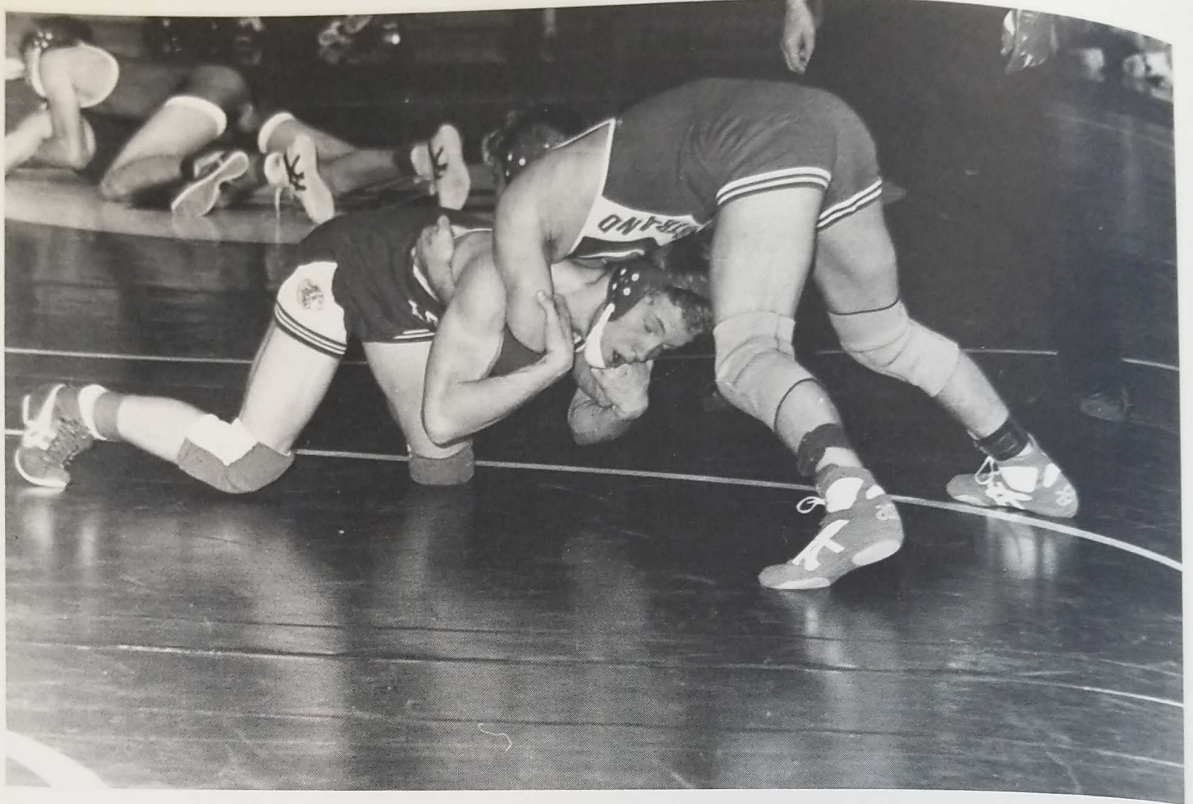

Hard work and team unity made the 1990-1991 wrestling season one of the most exciting ever.

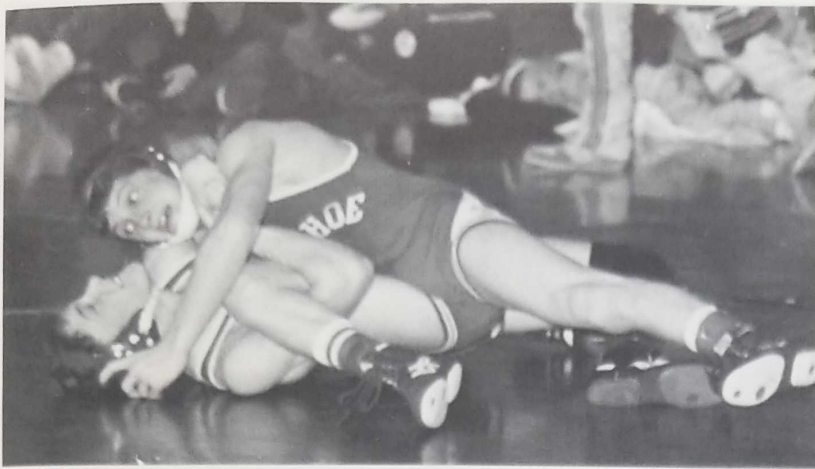

The team placed second in districts and eleventh in state competition.

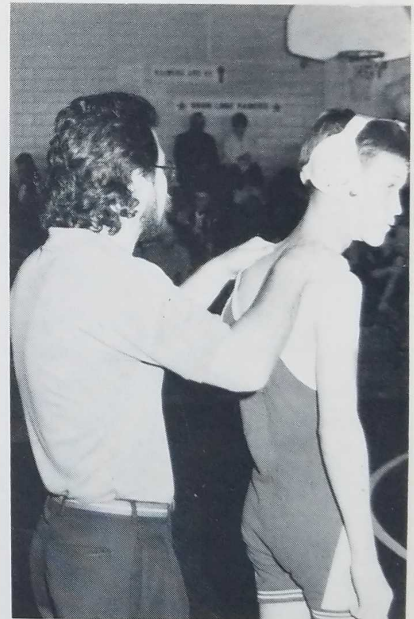
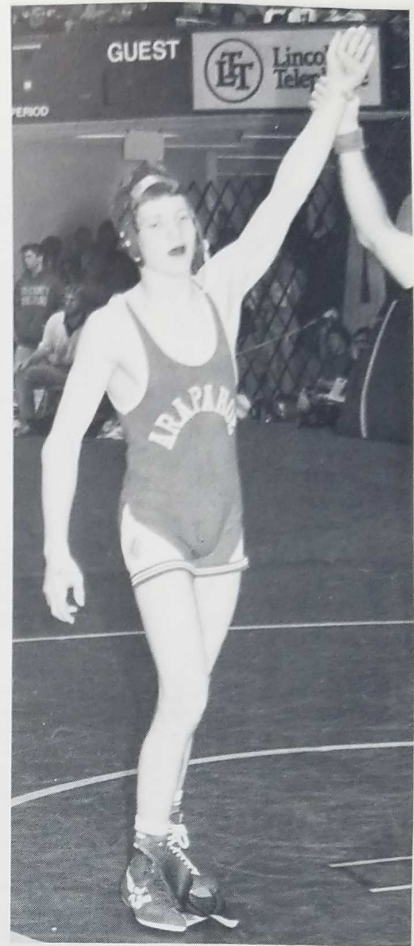

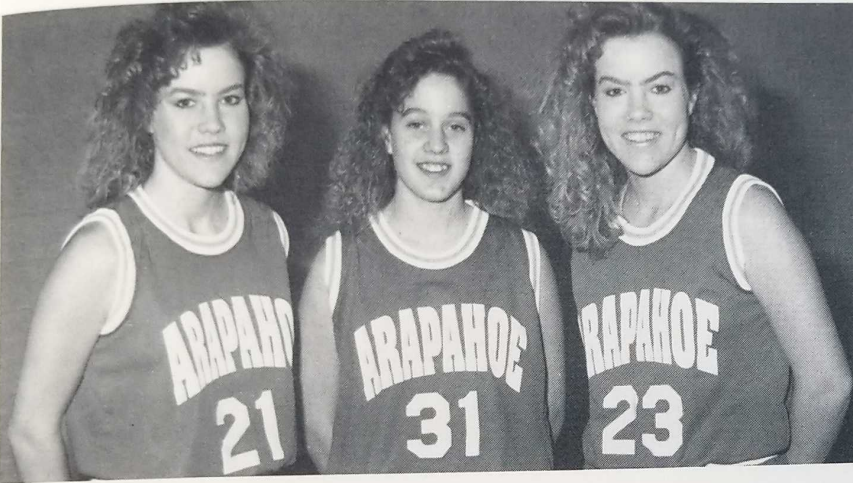

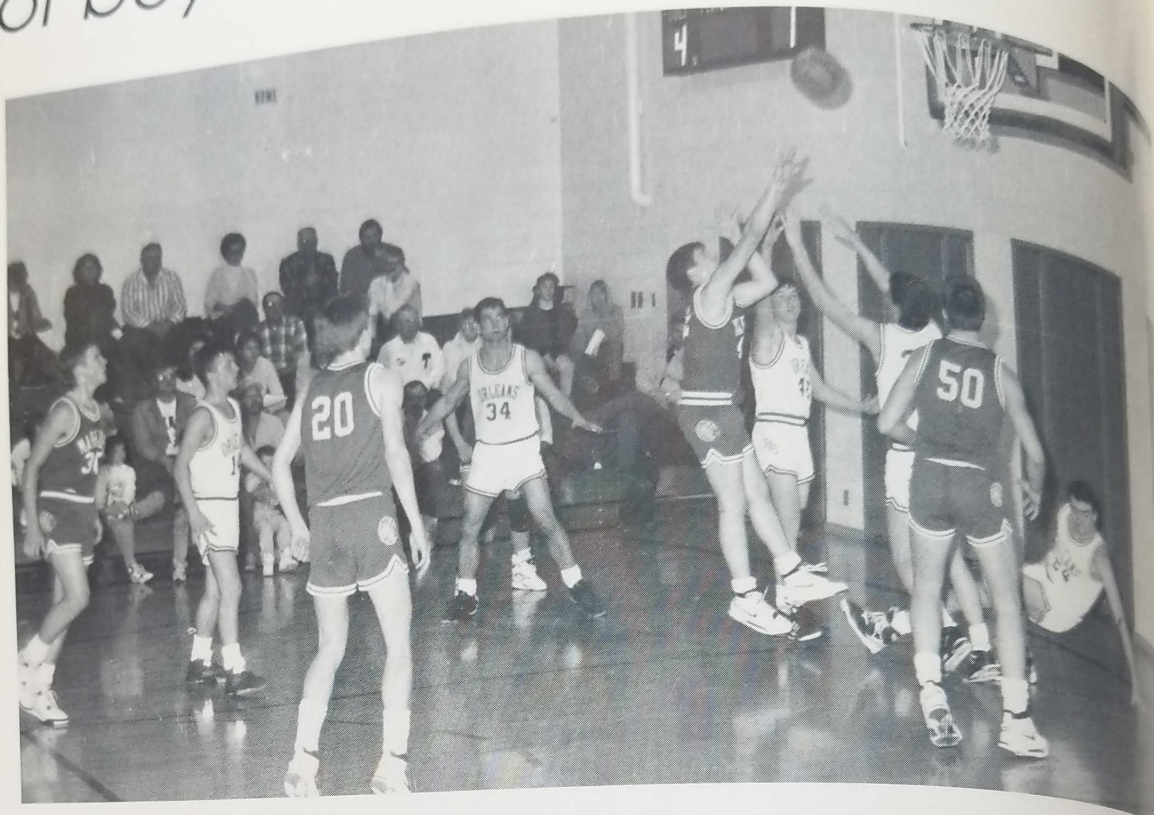

Bright years ahead for boy's basketball team



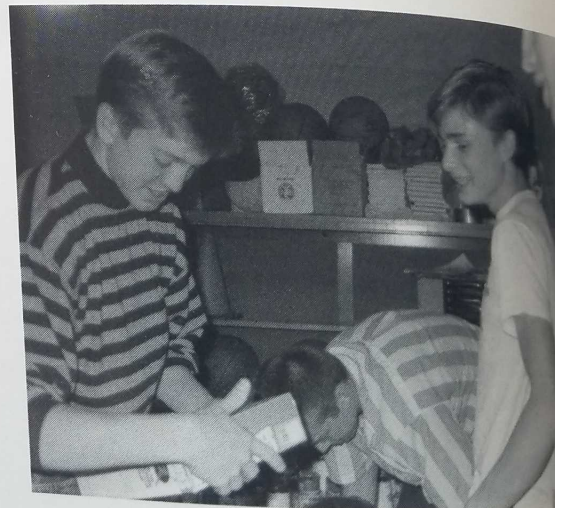

Senior Greg Schroeder followed with 153 points, averaging 9.6 points per game. Schroeder also led in steals with 28 and was leading rebounder with 118.

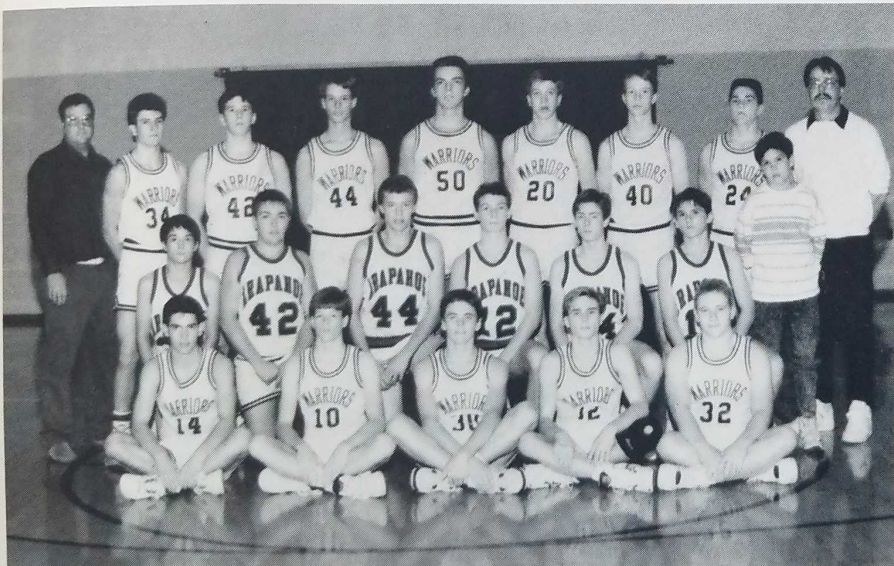

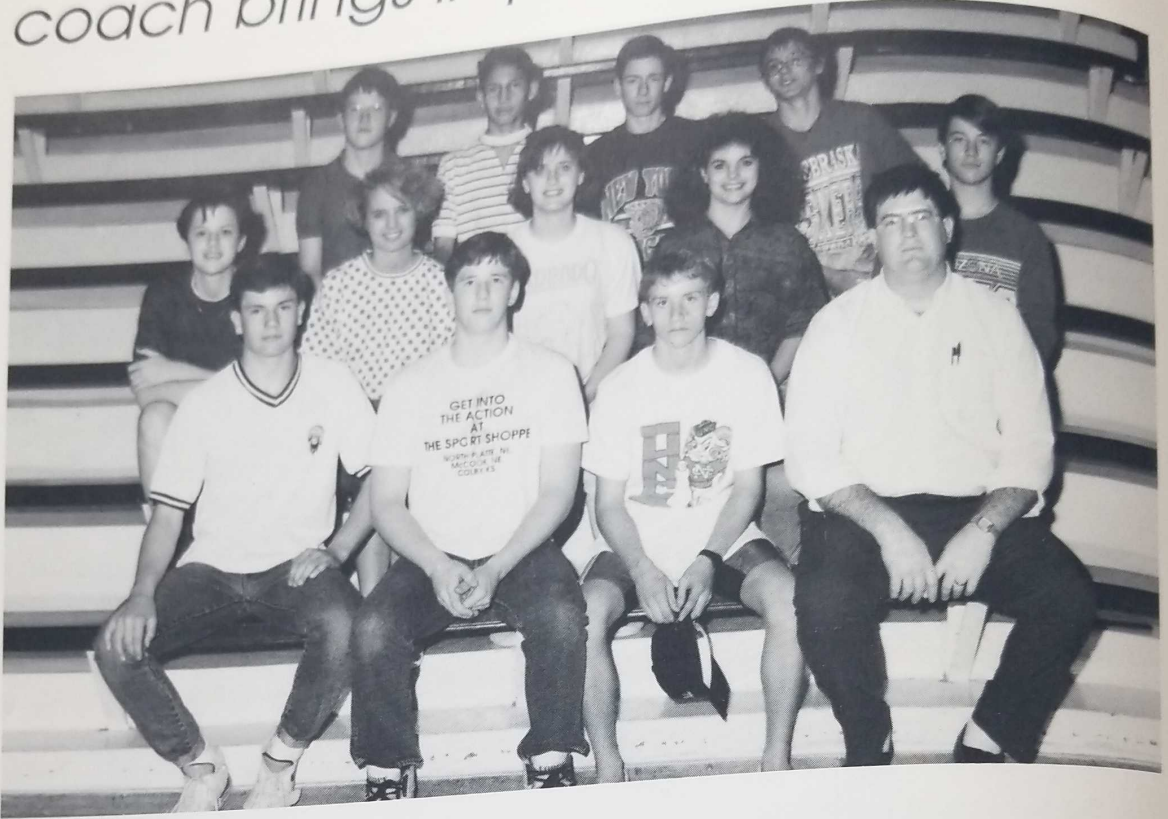
