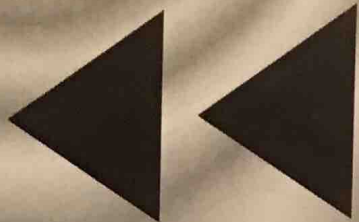


Start the Commotion...

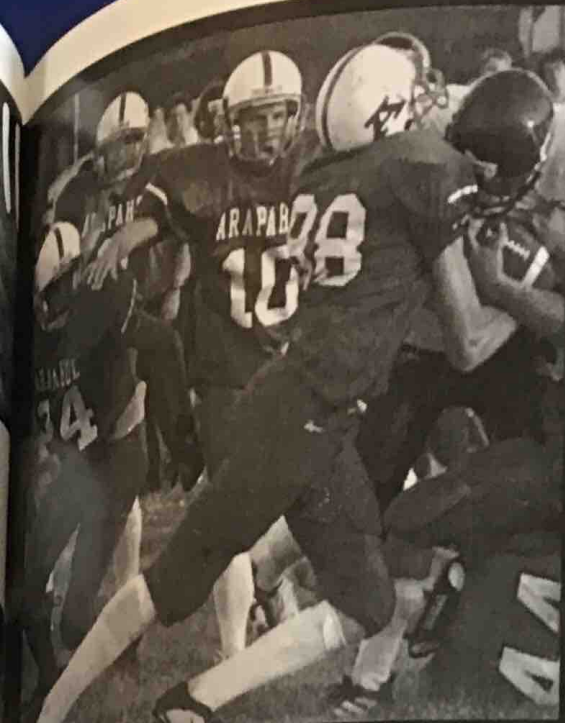

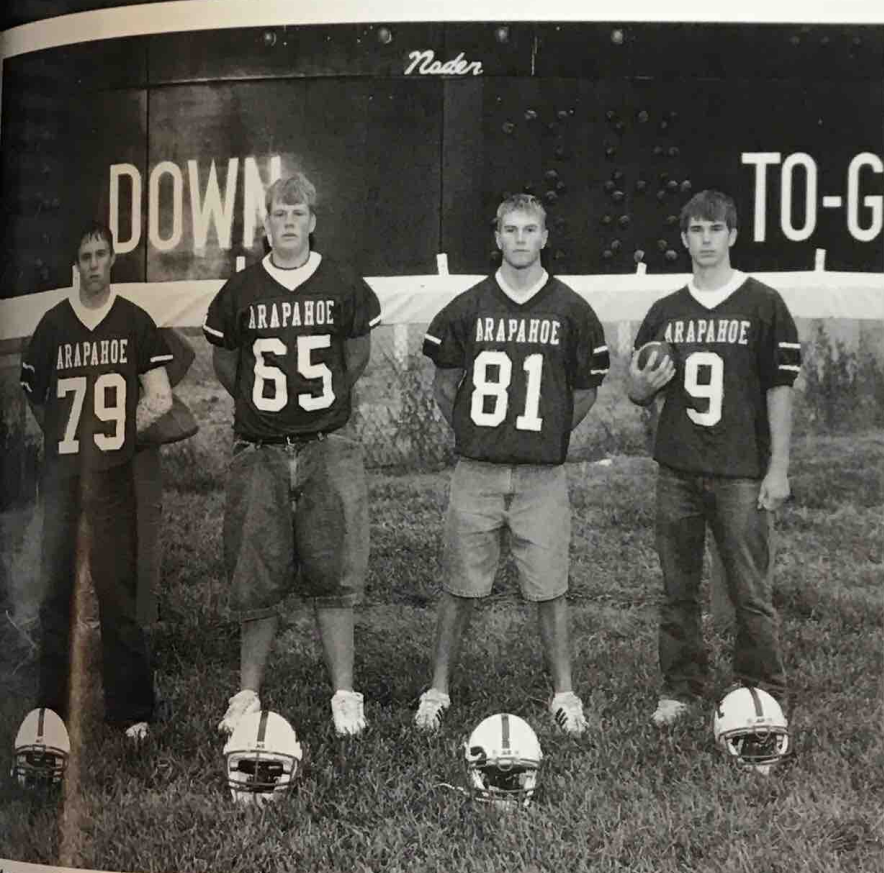

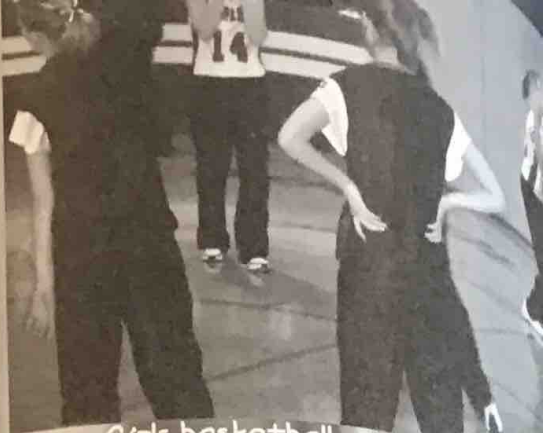
No matter what the sporting event is, someone either on the team or the coach is always saying "give it your all." A-Club is an organization that consists of all the athletes that have lettered at AHS.

They also take tickets and sweep the floor before and between games. After it is all done, the members are responsible for the cleaning up of both game area and the concessions area.

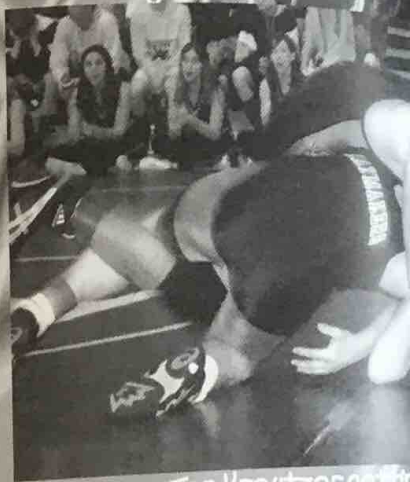

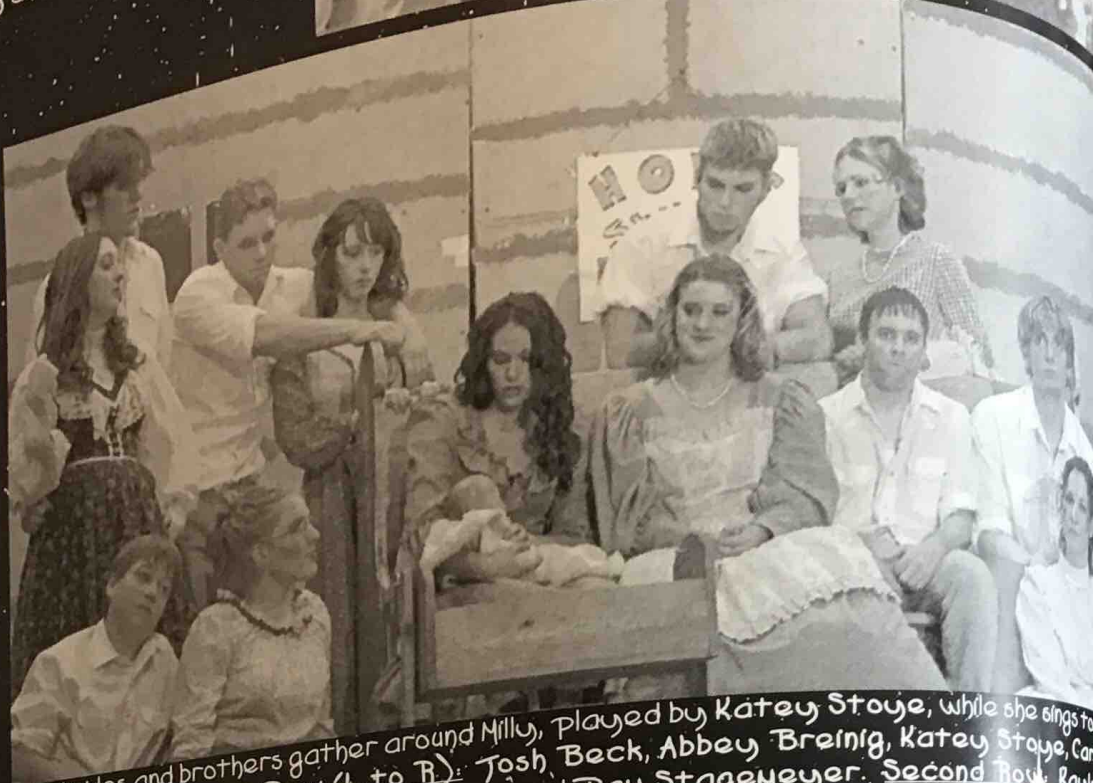

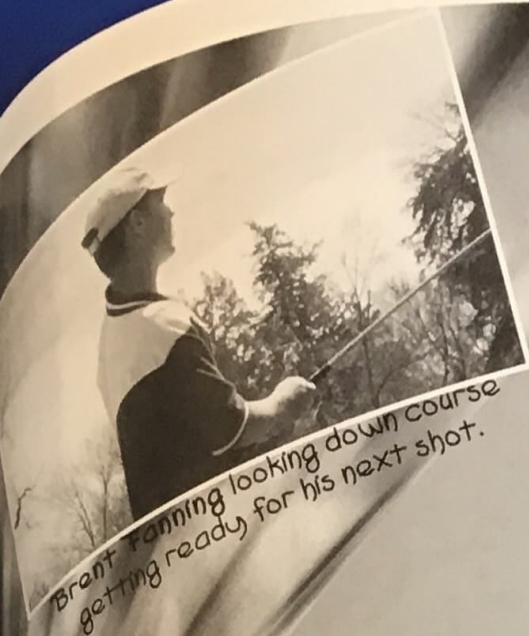

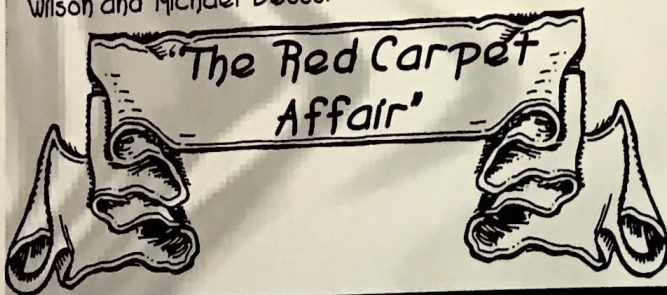

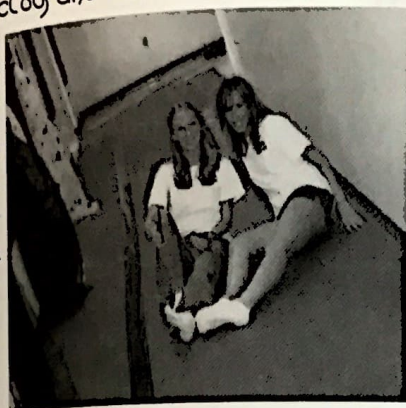

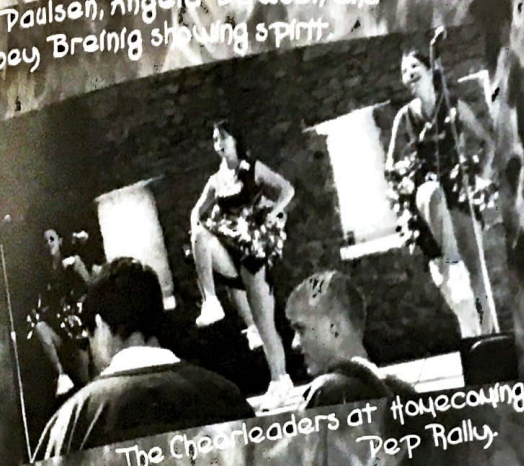

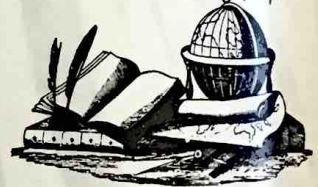

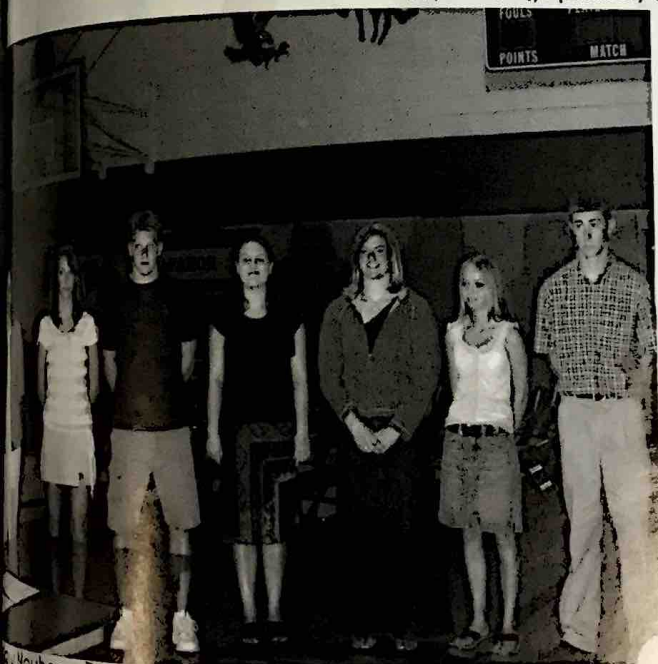

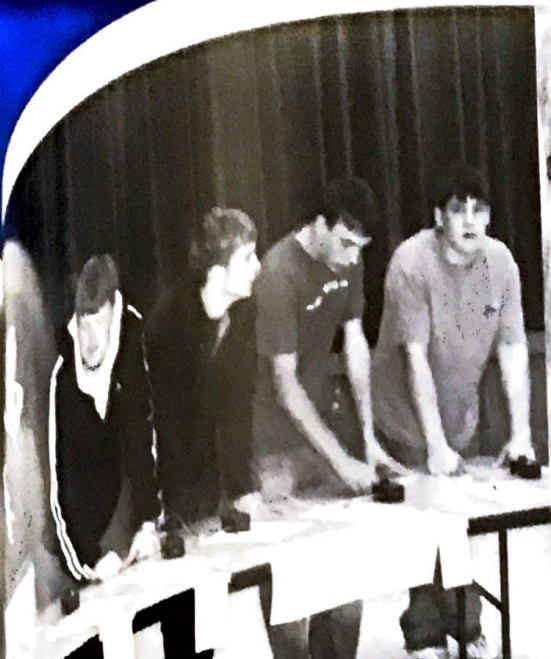

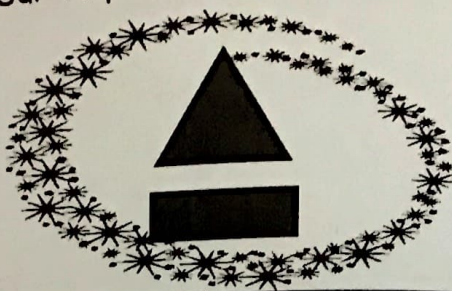
