- AHS Head Coach Daren Hatch was named as an assistant coach for the Shrine Bowl South Team.

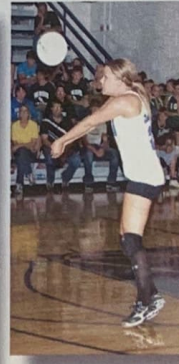

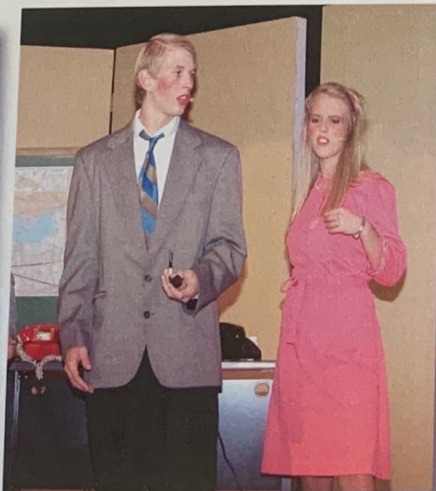

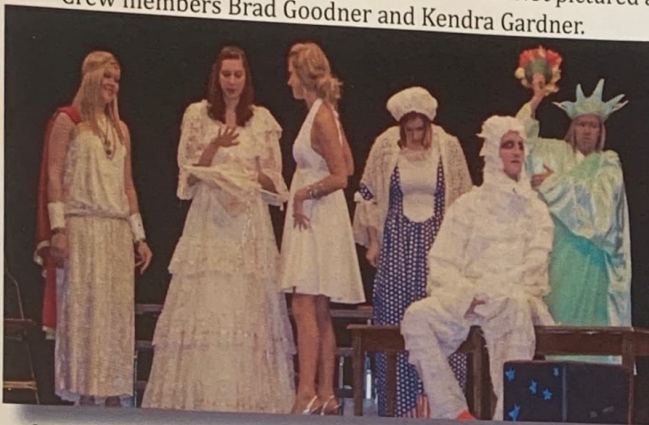

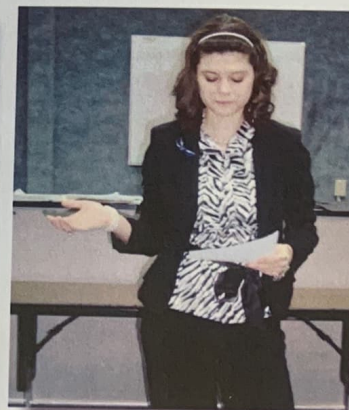

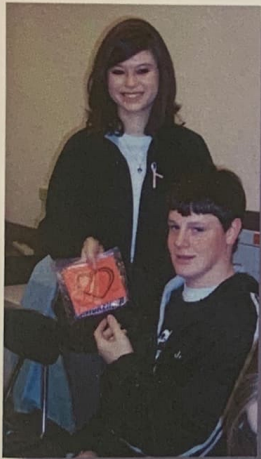

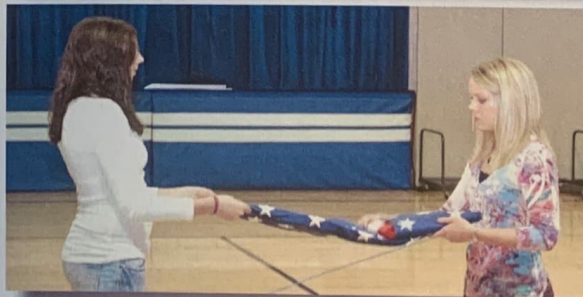

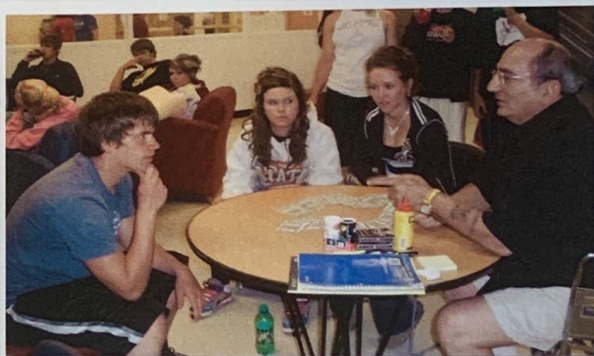
