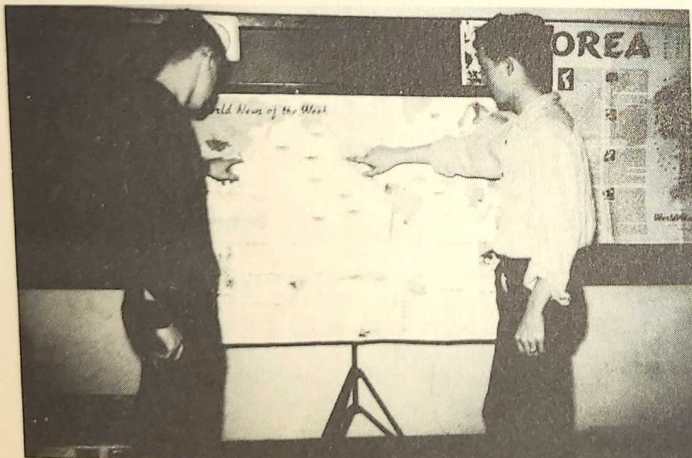
COMMERCIAL

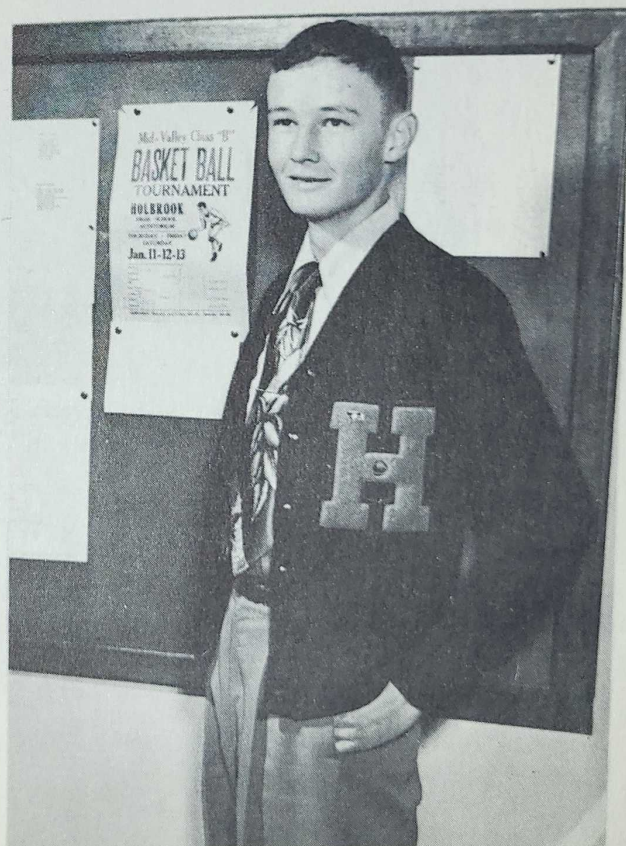

The freshmen have enjoyed this year and hope to enjoy the years to come.

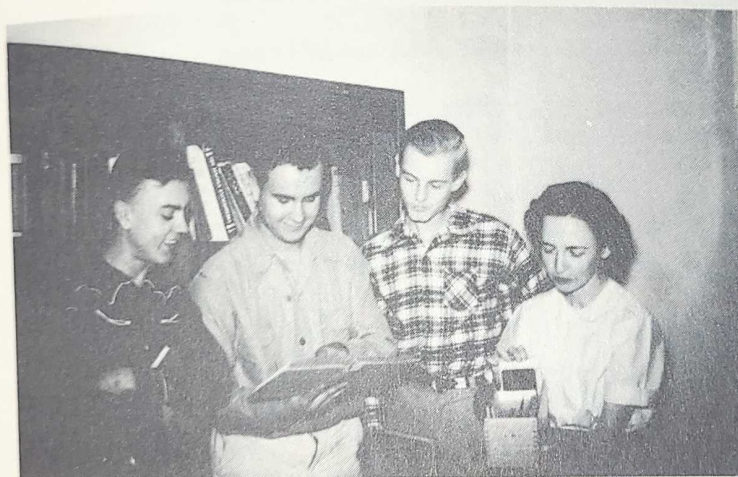
Important People
