The first team had a fair season as they won seven and lost eight. They were seeded second in the District Basketball Tournament at Cambridge.

There were two seniors on the first team and three juniors.

The first team outscored their opponents 897 to 717, and we averaged 59.8, while our opponents only got 47.8.

The second team had a brighter season as they won 8 and lost 5.

They also outscored their opponents 449 to 406 and had an average of 34.5, while they held their opponents to an average of 30 points per game.
